Y adventure camp begins

A YMCA adventure camp began earlier this week with 16 children between the ages of 12 and 14 and four YMCA counsellors taking a 26-mile canoe trip from Honey Harbour to Flat Rock Falls.
The program started on Monday with a two day orientation period where the participants learned how to pack and use the equipment needed, with the acutal trip taking place from today through to Friday.
The group will be using seven canoes that the Y's Men provided earlier this year and six new three-

pound tents.
The camp began as a new program last year and was such a success that it is being held again this year. According to Anne Bourgeois, program director of the YMCA, the kids are more enthusiastic about the canoeing than the camping program.
The YMCA ran two daycamps this summer, one at Little Lake Park and the other at the 16th concession at Lafontaine where the children had to be bused out to the camp.
The YMCA is in the

process of planning its fall and winter programs but it will probably include nursery school, TAB (Take a break), ballroom dancing, interior decorating, yoga, bridge, archery and crafts for both adults and children.
The YMCA pool began its last summer session of swimming instruction on Monday and will run for two weeks. The pool will then be closed for repairs, but will resume with its fall schedule which will include such programs as baby instruction and skindiving.
