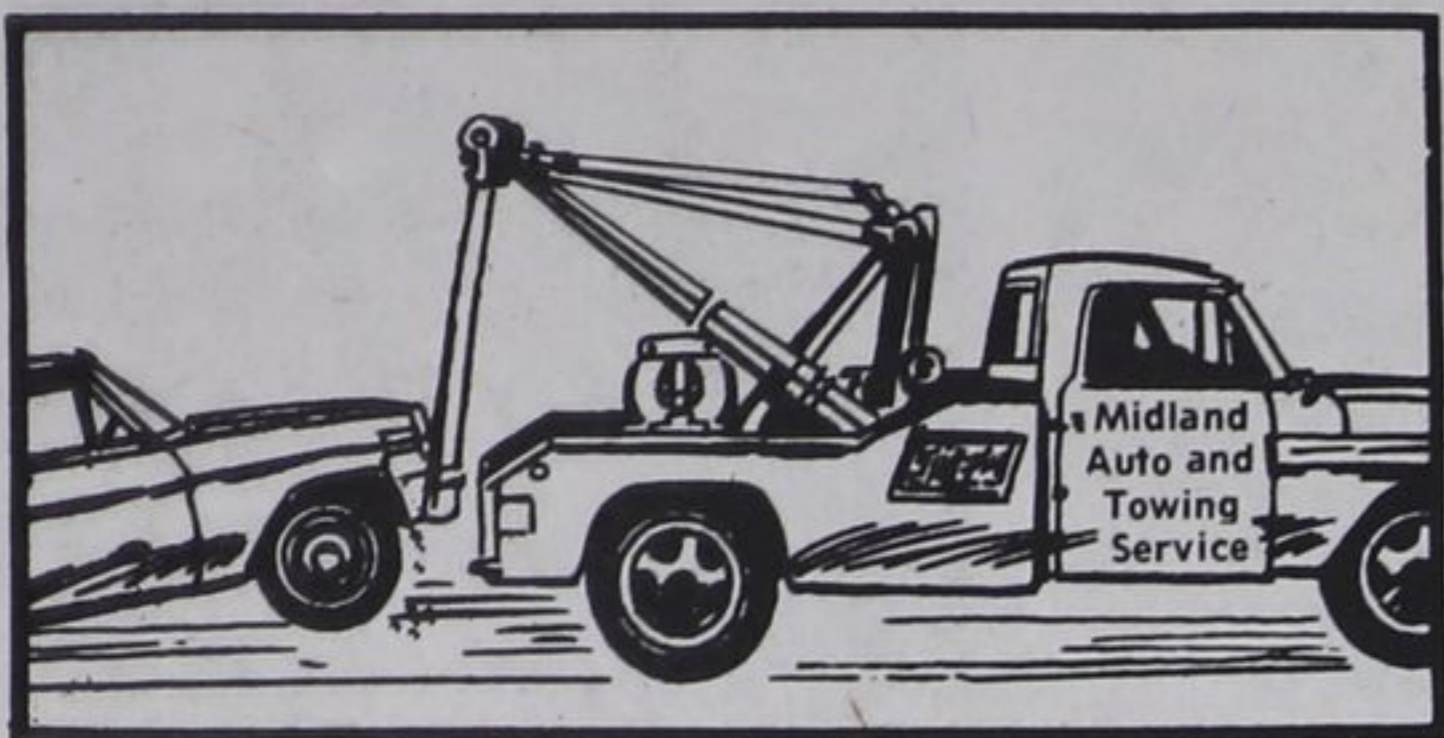

## Figure skating club calls off "Alice in Wonderland"

Executives and members of the Midland Figure Skating Club were in a severe state of shock when the news was received on Thursday March 18, that the

Midland Arena Gardens was closed officially that day at noon by order of the Ministry of Labour. Last minute arrangements for the ice carnival, that was to be held April 3, were in high gear, costumes and props rented, and all members of the club, had worked for two years to skate in "Alice in Wonderland", a show, that promised to be the biggest and best the club ever put on the ice.

But with one stroke of the pen of the Ministry of Labour, it was not to be. NOT YET...that is. For after an emergency meeting of the executives and a method of submitting and eliminating, it was decided that the ice carnival would have to be postponed until the arena has received clearance from the Ministry of Labour. It is hoped that the show can be held in

the later part of November or early in December. It was the unanimous decision of the executives that the show must go on. One hundred and fifty skaters worked hard and looked forward with great anticipation to the production of "Alice in Wonderland". Secondly, the budget of the Midland Figure Skating Club includes revenues of the

show, and although a complete cancellation of the ice carnival would mean the end of the club, it certainly is acknowledged that it does create a great financial strain.

The executives announced that the moneys for tickets purchased will be refunded on March 27, at the Midland Civic Center (formerly the Armouries) from 10 a.m.

til 2 p.m. Club members will also be able to pick up a refund for the costume rental, same place, same time.

Club members are urged to turn in all tickets unsold and also money received from ticket sale. Donations to the club will also be refunded. Canvassers will be in personal contact with donors shortly.

IDL's Jim Vaillancourt netted a single, making it

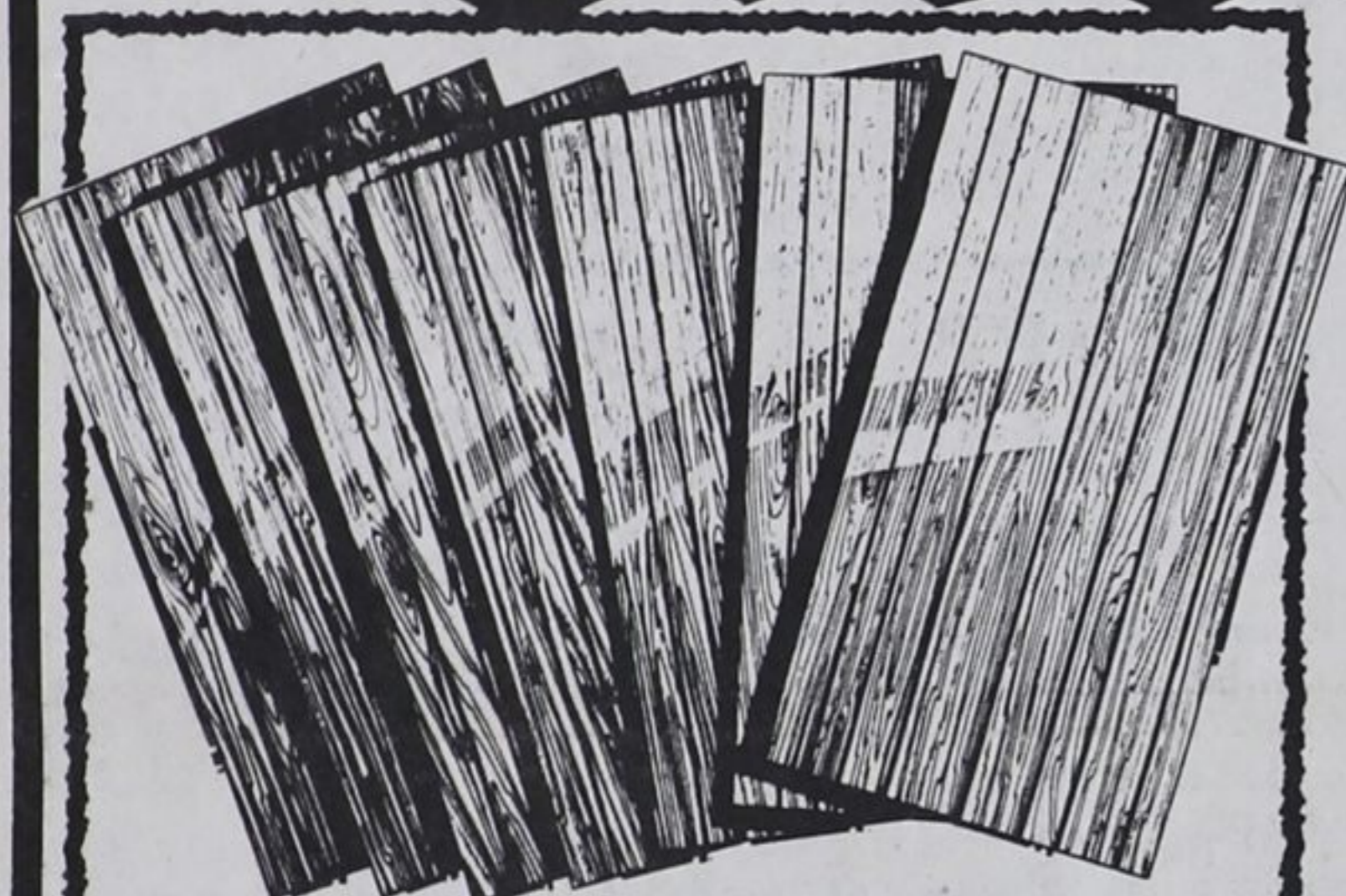
6-4 and Bob John scored Wonder Bread's final tally at the halfway mark of the period.
