## Chamber budget approved

The Board of directors of the Midland chamber of commerce recently approved its 1976 budget calling for total expenditures of \$28,571.

The chamber, in its April newsletter, noted that the budget includes revenues of \$3,680, giving a surplus of \$2,109. The surplus is designed to recover the approximate \$2,000 deficit which occurred from the 1975 operations.

The chamber's finance committee will be entering discussions with the town council in order to determine what sort of contractual arrangements would be made for the future handling of industrial and commercial and tourist development on behalf of the municipality.

With the retirement of R.B. Moffatt as general manager and industrial spokesman, the chamber directors felt that an entirely new financial arrangement should be entered into with the municipality before a successor to Moffatt is employed. In its release, the chamber pointed out that "the combining in one person of the industrial development spokesman and the chamber manager had been advantageous to the town government and the business community".

The sharing of the cost of industrial promotion between the chamber and the municipal government has saved Midland many thousands of dollars over the years, according to the newsletter.

Inflation, however, has made it impossible for the chamber to make as great a financial contribution to this joint program as it has in the past, and it is in this aspect of the situation that the chamber's finance committee wish to discuss with council in the future.

The chamber raised membership fees this year by 15 per cent in an effort to help out the revenue shortage, but "even this is insufficient to provide the financing needed."

Retail services committee

The "salute to Midland public works" was just the first of several projects to be undertaken by the chamber's retail services committee this year. Other promotions include the Mother's Day, Father's Day promotions, the sidewalk sale, a boat show, and the Christmas lighting program.

The retail services committee comprises five directors — Peter Palmer, Ernie Cowden,

Bob Voorzanger, Ralph Lynn and Bob Duncan — and members Martin Lamers, Tom Barber, Murray Mostyn, Steve Orr, Dan Herbert, Lloyd Graham, John Romanko, John McLaren, Frank Bemben and Stan Dion. The committee is trying a new approach this year in attempting to obtain a lump sum financial contribution which will pay for all of the promotions for the entire year. Obtaining the money in this way will not only save a great many man hours, but will enable the committee to plan its activities in advance knowing the amount of money which will be available for each

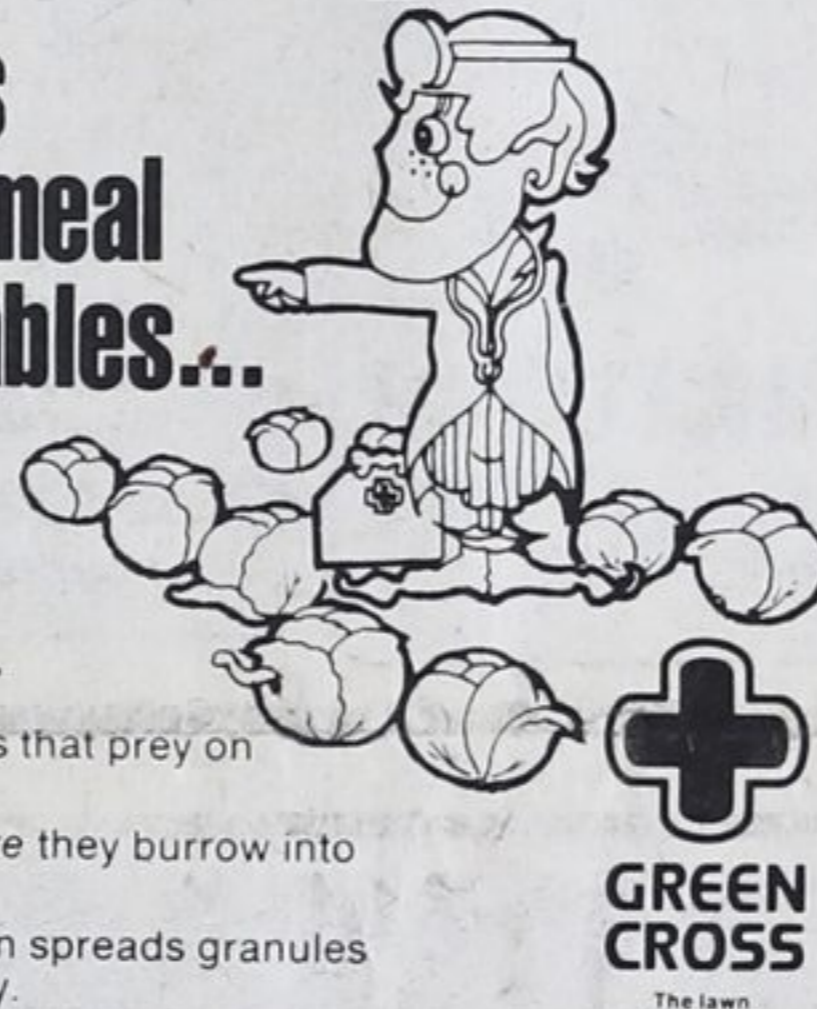
promotion. Industrial promotion Negotiations with several firms interested in locating in Midland are continuing. In addition to a number of firms with whom original contacts were made during 1975, and who have not yet made a final decision as to a Midland location, the Industrial Development committee of the chamber has been contacted by several additional companies since the beginning of this year. In its report to the board, the committee said it "is hopeful that it may be able to announce a further new industry for Midland in the near future."

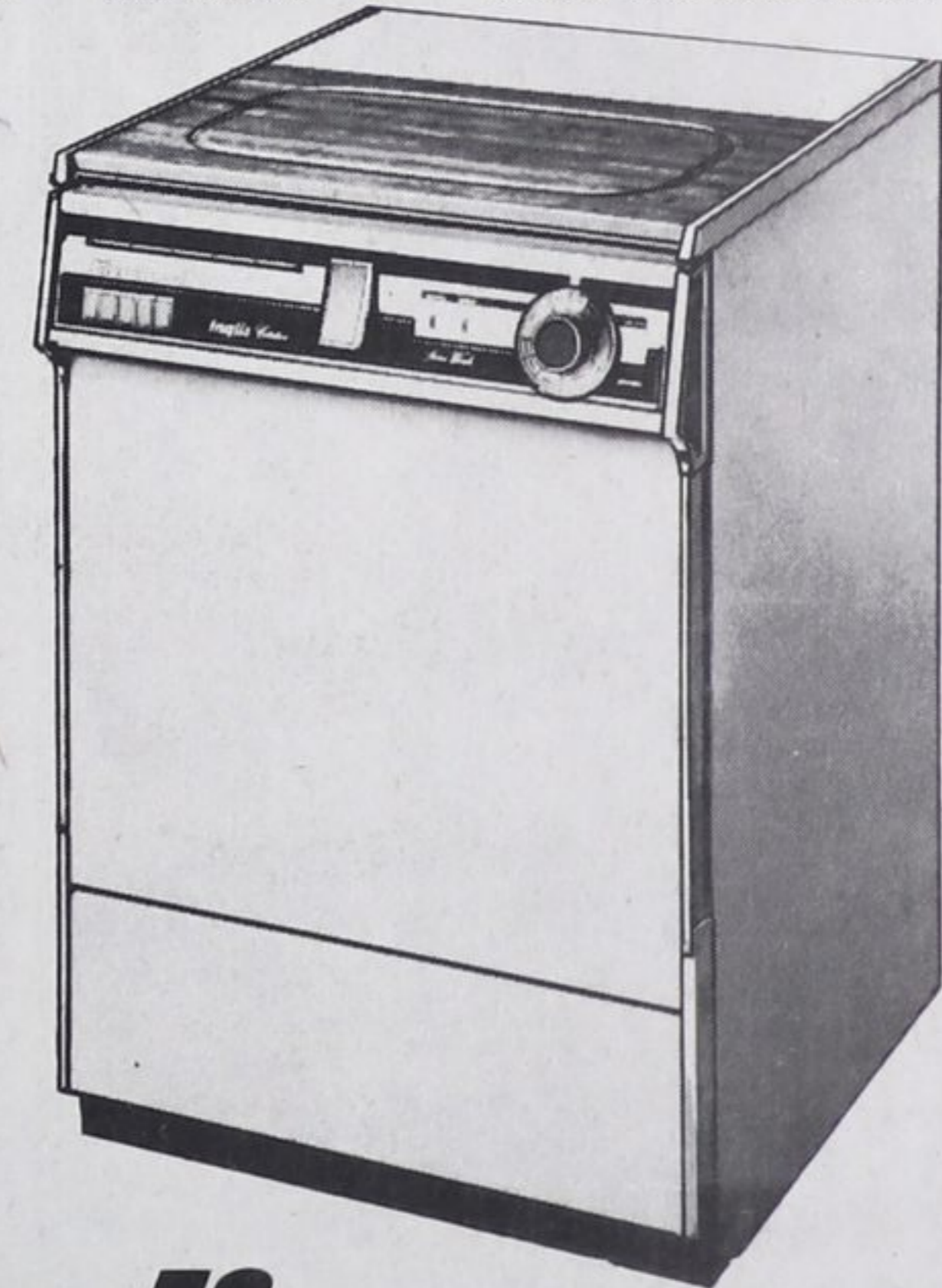
