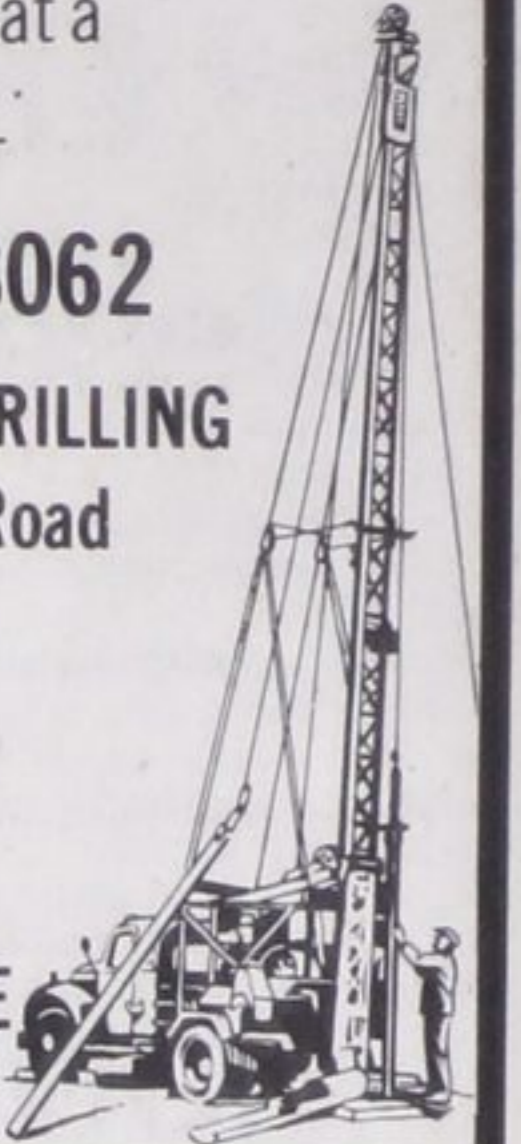

Four senior students, Ian Nicklin, Sonya van Der Swan, Jeanne Quesnelle and David Paille took turns conducting the group, and did so with finesse and aplomb.

A second surprise was provided by Nonie Thompson in her first appearance as vocalist with the PSS Swing Band. She has a rich, ringing voice (which at times was needlessly over-miked) and showed a convincing feeling for ballad singing.

The intermediate band

played a well-balanced program of works by Schubert, Gordon, Corelli and Webber and then another surprise materialised in the form of a girl's choir, directed by Grade twelve student Denise Daniels. The group has been together only a very short time. They worked without music, paid close at-

tention to their leader and produced a well balanced and always harmonious sound. It's to be hoped that this fine ensemble will continue to contribute to the PSS music program. The Senior Band played seven numbers by Wagner, Von Suppe, Gamble, Holst, Bennet, Kabalevsky and Cacvas.

Their polish approached professional quality at times.

This is music head John Coull's fifth year at PSS and in that time he has brought the senior band to a fine peak of perfection. Many of the instrumentalists graduate this year but the musical future is bright at PSS. One has only to listen to

the up-and-coming musicians in the Junior and Intermediate bands to be convinced.
