Clubs sponsor wine and cheese

The Midland Civitan Club and the Midland Lionettes are pitching in

to help out the Huronia Association for the Mentally Retarded as it prepares for an ambitious fund-raising drive.

The Huronia association will be launching a campaign on May 17 to raise money for new facilities for the Adult Rehabilitation Centre (ARC) in Midland. Volunteers will be canvassing industries, businesses, and households to reach the objective of \$25,000 — and they'll have two weeks to do so.

The two local service groups will be hosting a benefit wine and cheese party and dance at 8:00 p.m. on May 14 at the Midland Civic Centre with the hope of adding to the building fund coffers. ARC industries is presently housed in a

building on William Street, constructed in 1974 to accommodate 24 ARC clients. With enrolment presently standing at 45 and 12 more on the waiting list, the need for the enlarged building is acute.

Of the \$250,000 estimated price tag on the proposed building, the Ministry of Community and Social Services will be kicking in 80 per cent. Some money will be raised by the sale of the present building, but the remainder must be raised from the community.
