

The old Honey Harbor Boat Works has been in the Milner family for generations but present members of the family indicated that they would be closing down this year.

Rather than allow the marina to fall into hands which might destroy it as a boating facility, a group of cottagers in the Honey Harbor vicinity have formed an association

and taken it over. The closing of the boat works or its development as a non-marine facility such as a cottage subdivision, would have been diastrous for Georgian Bay boating the membership chaircommunity.

Honey Harbor is one of the best jumping off points for the entire Thirty Thousand Islands area of Georgian Bay, the most fabulous fresh water cruising grounds in the
