PSS boys win seventh CKMP meet in a row

The Penetanguishene Secondary School boys' track and field team won the eighth annual CKMP Track Meet last week — the seventh year in the row they have done so. The senior boys put on their best showing of the year, capturing 10 first-place finishes.

Jim Walsh swept the 1,500 and 3,000 meter events with Bill Puddicombe placing second in the 1,500 meter. John Larmand won the pole vault, long and triple-jump events and placed second in the high jump. Greg Quesnelle threw for firsts in the shot put

and discus as Brian Bidan and Glen Trotter placed second in the respective events. Steve Robillard swept the hurdles while Tim Downie and Ken Marchildon ran for second and third-place finishes in the 100 and 200 meters respectively. Brian Bidan was first in

the 400 meter. Bill Puddicombe and Steve Robillard placed second and third in the 800-meter event. Gord Dusome threw the javelin for second place in that field event. The (4 x 100) relay team squeezed by Midland in the final 50 meters to take first place honors for

Ken Marchildon, Brian Bidan, Andy Lacroix and Tim Downie doing the running for PSS. The junior boys grabbed seven first-place finishes in the hurdles (Pierre Therrien), 1,500 meter (Randy Promm), 3,000 meter (Alvin Buttineau), long jump (Joe Rankin), pole vault (Dave Pause and Glen Larmand) and a record showing in the discus by Dave Leblanc.

Other top finishers were Tom Pauze in the hurdles, Dave Leblanc third in the 100 meter, Tom Pauze second in the 200 meter followed closely by Andy Lacroix, Paul Robillard second and

third respectively in the 800 and 400 meters, Gary Bonnin second in high jump, Ken Tessier second in javelin, Alvin Buttineau second in shot put and discus, and finally the (4 x 100) relay team of Tom Pauze, Dave Leblanc, Paul Robillard and Lloyd Cascagnette running away with first place.

The midget boys did just as well picking up seven first-place ribbons. Lloyd Cascagnette paced them with four firsts: in the 100 meters; high jump, shot put and a remarkable record jump of 20 feet and one-half inch in the long jump. Dave Cadeau ran for first in the 3,000 meter and Jeff Breeden threw

the javelin and discus for first-place honors in those two events. Other top finishers were second-place efforts from Kevin St. Amant in the 400-meter race, Rick Dorion in the triple jump, Brent Farquhar in the javelin and shot put and the (4 x 100) relay team of James Rankin, Brian Axten, Kevin St. Amant and Robert Desroches who are getting faster.

Cascagnette sets record at meet

Penetanguishene Secondary School sent Dave Cadeau, Lloyd Cascagnette, Brent Farquhar and Vince Garrett to the Westdale track and field meet held Saturday at McMaster University in Hamilton. The team placed third overall. Individually, Lloyd Cascagnette finished first in the long jump and set a 100-meter record of 11.3

seconds. He also placed second in the 200-meter event with his own best time ever of 23.4 seconds. Dave Cadeau had a personal best time of 10:30.3 in the 3,000 metres and Brent Farquhar had his best throw ever as he tossed the discus 35.30 metres.

Vince Garrett placed ninth out of 50 entrants in the javelin event. PSS finished overall behind Michael Power School of Toronto and M.M. Robinson School of Burlington which captured first place at the meet.
