McLean wins

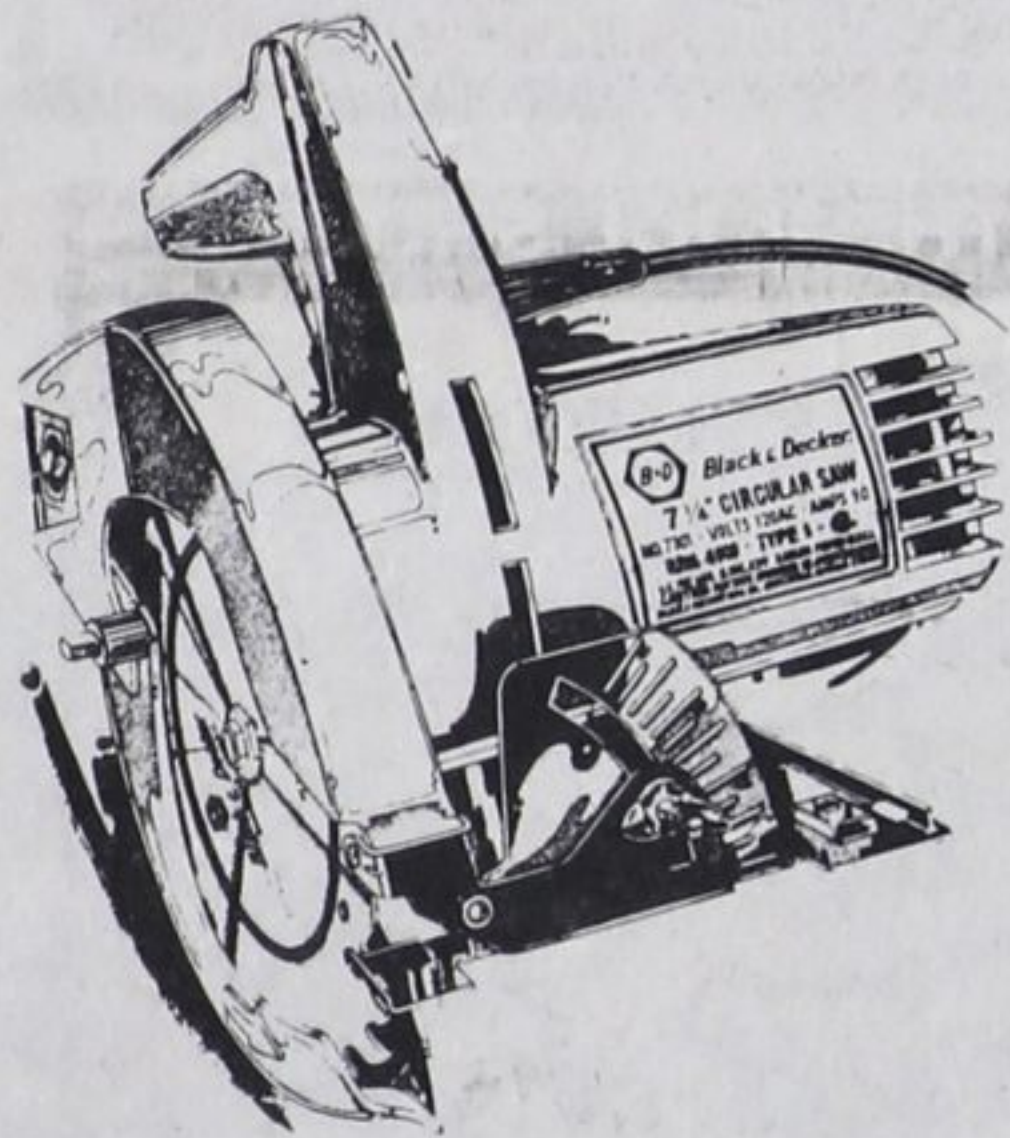
Frank McLean came with a 77 on 18 holes in the Midland Golf and Country Club Eager Beaver golf tournament held last week to capture first low gross.
