## Tay discusses official plan

Tay Township Planning Board passed a resolution last week to remove two study areas from the proposed official plan.

The two areas in Port Severn were taken off the draft plan leaving only the hamlet of Waubaushe as an area for further study. A secondary plan may be drawn up for Waubaushe after the official plan is passed.

Port Severn is now designated as a hamlet where it had no recognition before. A limited strip of the shoreline will be limited to seasonal service. The board has not defined which services will be unavailable to residents during the winter months. They may include no garbage pick-up and snow removal.

"People may have to use ski-doos if they wish to get into their places in the winter," said planning board secretary Brian Hopkins.

Since Valentine's Day of 1975 Tay Township has

been under a ministerial zoning order. This order has acted as a freeze on building on properties of less than 25 acres.

The freeze zones the township according to the existing official plan which stipulates that any new building must have a minimum of 25 acres surrounding it.

The planning board is drawing up a brand new zoning by-law which it has never had before, said Hopkins.

Hopkins said he has no idea when the official plan will be ready for presentation to council. At the meeting last week, the planning board began working its way through an 18 page letter from the Ministry of Housing which contains questions and suggestions for the consideration of the planning board.

"Our regular meeting is tonight. We hope to finish with the usual business early, and then get back to the official plan."

## New airport manager takes over

Huron Airport's new manager is no newcomer to the business.

Nick Parmegiani replaces Peter Crampton who recently resigned from the post.

Before coming to Huronia, Parmegiani had been working for one and a half years in the arctic, flying DC3's for LambAir.

Previous to this he held several positions at airports near Toronto as chief flying instructor.

Parmegiani received his training at the Buttonville airport and flying school which is the largest of its kind in Canada.

In 1966 he obtained his

pilot's license and began flying. He now holds an airline transport pilot license which is the top of the line as far as flying licenses go.

A certified flying instructor, Parmegiani is qualified to instruct beginners, right up to those working towards their commercial license.

The airport offers lessons seven days a week.

"If someone calls for a lesson, there will always be someone here," said Parmegiani.

He said the airport is now offering instruction in instrument reading.

The use of an airplane

costs \$35 an hour with an instructor and about \$19 if the person is qualified to solo.

Charters can be easily arranged through the

airport.

"We can take people anywhere they want to go in either Canada or the United States," said Parmegiani.

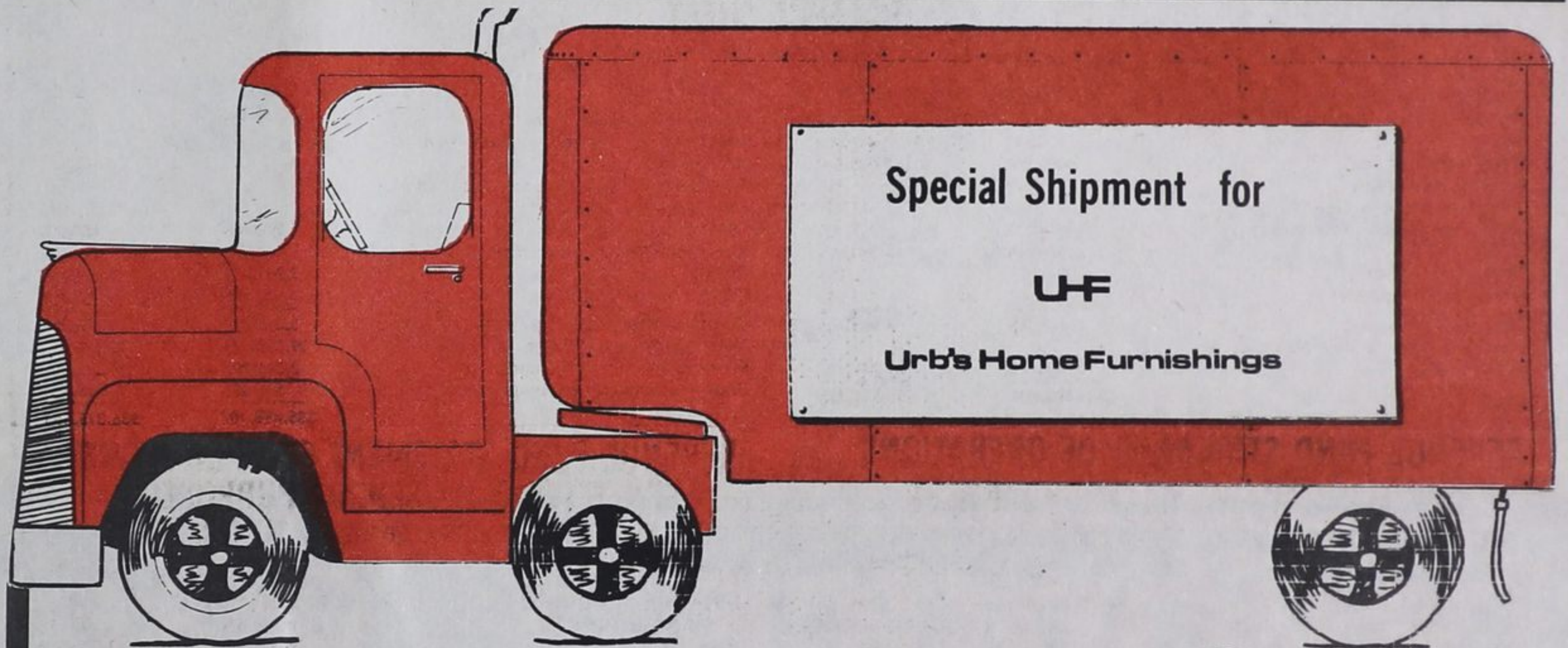

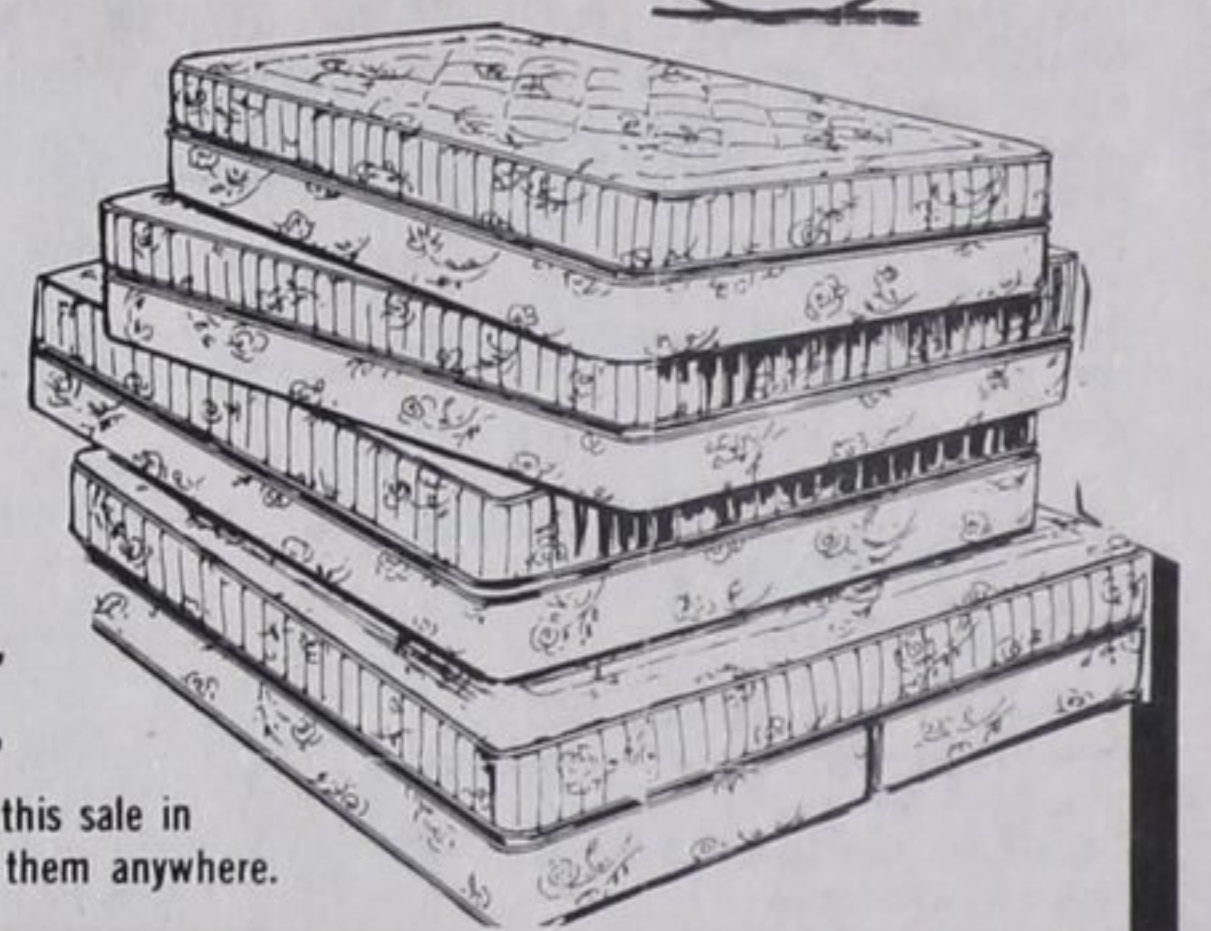

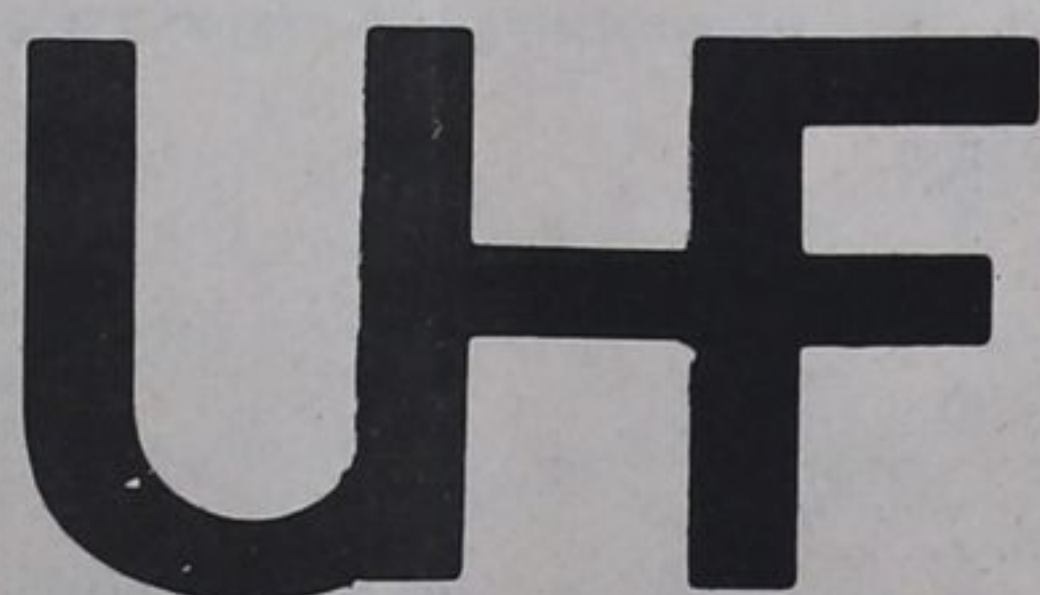
