INTARIO LOTTERY CORPORATION INVITES APPLICATIONS FOR

The Ontario Lottery Corporation from time to time has territories come available in various parts of the Province for the distribution of Wintario tickets.

A distributor is required to be actively engaged on a full time basis in the operation of the distributorship, each distributor must employ adequate sales personnel, and maintain sound accounting and clerical office practices.

Wintario distributors are independent businessmen working on a commission basis. A distributor is required to pre-pay for Wintario tickets and re-sell them to the 500 or so Wintario retail outlets in his territory. The current commission structure for each draw is 21/2 cents per Wintario ticket for the first 100,000 tickets and 2 cents each on the remaining Wintario tickets sold.

In accordance with an agreement with Olympic Lottery, Wintario distributors presently act as wholesale distributors for Olympic Lottery tickets as well.

Sales reports and audited financial statements will be required by the Corporation.

At present vacancies exist in territories centered in Toronto, Paris and Windsor. Others may arise in the future and all applications received will be kept on file from which any future vacancies could be filled without further public notice.





