

New radar device in use in Orillia

The Ontario Provincial Police in Orillia are now using their latest weapon against speeding drivers. Speed gun, as the new radar system is called is almost four times as efficient in catching

speeders as the traditional system is. The new unit costs about \$3,000 and may be installed in any car. The car need not be stationary for the system to work and with the system

speeders may clock speeders from any direction and from a radius of about one mile. The big advantage of the unit is that it can be used at night where the old system couldn't said

an OPP spokesman in Orillia. There are only eight of these units in the province. The system is a recent invention and Orillia has been using it since the beginning of this month.

Speed gun is being used on all major highways in the Orillia area.

Energy Probe discussion tonight

The public is invited to attend a free talk with slides entitled "The Solar Age — Renewable Energy and Canada's Future", to be given by Mr. Richard Fine of Energy Probe.

The Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre is sponsoring the talk tonight, Wednesday, May 26 at 7:30 p.m.

Fine will be talking about such energy alternatives as wind energy, tidal power, solar energy, heat from within the earth, and the use of methane gas given off

from manure and other sources.

Energy Probe is undertaking a renewable energy campaign, and the stop in Midland is just one of many for Richard Fine.

Fine began working at Energy Probe in September 1975 after completing his M.A. Sc. in Electrical Engineering at the University of Toronto.

He is Energy Probe's renewable energy person and is the author of Energy Probe's Renewable Energy Handbook.

On July 1, 1976, an amendment to the Food and Drug Regulation will force retailers to sell their ground beef under one of three names, instead of the nearly 30 used on the retail market at the moment.

Ground meat is to be termed Regular if it contains 30 per cent fat or less, Medium if it contains 23 per cent or less and Lean if it contains 17 per cent or less.

Bryce Mackasey, Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs and Marc Lalonde, Minister of Health and Welfare made the announcement jointly and it is designed to make things simpler for consumers and retailers.
