On July 1, 1976, an amendment to the Food and Drug Regulation will force retailers to sell their ground beef under one of three names, instead of the nearly 30 used on the retail market at the

Ground meat is to be termed Regular if it contains 30 per cent fat or less, Medium if it contains 23 per cent or less and Lean if it contains 17

per cent or less. Bryce Mackasey, Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs and Marc Lalonde, Minister of Health and Welfare made the announcement jointly and it is designed to make things simpler for consumers and retailers.
