Arts and crafts festival set for July 8, 9, 10

It's that time of year again! Plans are well underway for the third annual Arts & Crafts Festival at St. Paul's United Church Midland.

The festival began in response to a need for local crafts people to have a sales outlet for their finished product. The festival committee decided at the outset that the purpose was not to raise money but to expose as many artisans as possible to the community. The committee, therefore, does not add any commission to the price set by each individual. All profits go directly to the exhibitor. The committee is responsible for the organization, publicity and insurance aspects of the show.

This year between 25 and 30 crafts people will fill the church hall to overflowing with painting, hand crafted and wheel thrown pottery, quilting, macramé, hooking, dried flower plaques, hanging pots, hand crafted dolls, lapidary and much more. In addition to those who sell their goods, a number of craftspeople volunteer to demonstrate their skills. Rotating displays of flower arranging, weaving, hooking, and quilting and spinning will fill the center area of the

hall. It is expected that the special atmosphere which has permeated the festival in previous years, will prevail. The excitement and joy of sharing a unique experience was paramount. Many people returned day after day to explore more booths, watch new demonstrations and share in the creative atmosphere.

Two new additions from last year will be continued. The Nurses' Alumni from St. Andrews Hospital will manage a tea room which provides luncheons. The aroma of freshly baked butter tarts and muffins will beckon many to take a quiet break from the hustle and bustle of the exhibitors' hall.

A supervised children's craft area filled with clay, building materials and creative 'junk' will be available for all children accompanying their parents to the show. So plan to spend part of a day browsing at the festival while your children 'create' and have a refreshing lunch or supper before making all those purchases!
