Why don't those who have not got work by the end of June start applying with hospitals, old people's homes, summer camps for handicapped children, and learn something of what it's like to give a little of themselves and get a lot back?

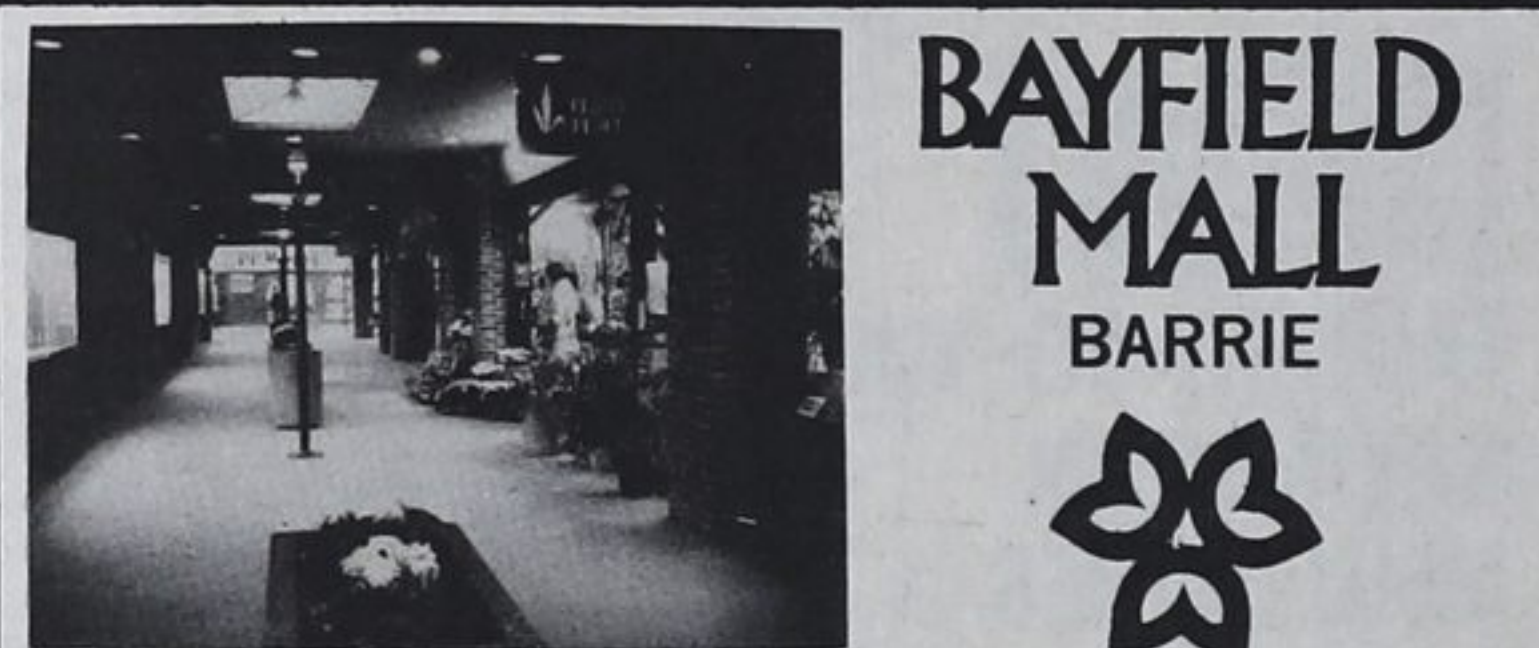
