Officials at Midland's Manpower Centre and the student offices in Midland and Penetanguishene filled a total of 156 regular and 33 casual vacancies during the month of May, reports manager Don McNeen in his month end report.

According to McNeen, these figures represent an increase over the previous month, but they are down from the same period in 1975.

A survey of area manufacturing firms revealed that new hirings were few and far between. And while some people were taken on as replacements to persons leaving, other firms have been experiencing layoffs.

Although the student centres are maintaining a placement level at roughly the same as in 1975, both centres have experienced a 13 per cent decline in vacancies listed so far this year. During May, the centres filled 79 vacancies.

In his report, McNeen noted that the Penetanguishene centre was a pilot venture to see what sort of response would be received from local employers and householders towards providing summer job opportunities for the town and surrounding student population.

At the end of May, a total of 1269 male and 1046 females were registered with Manpower. Of total, 500 are students, a slight increase over April levels.

A total of 115 vacancies are remained unfilled. Occupations included maintenance mechanic, tool and die maker, motor boat mechanic, heavy duty mechanic, drapery installer, truck crane operator, boat builder, cook waiter-waitress and furniture upholsterer. According to McNeen, the majority of the vacancies are for skilled people, while a large number of the people registered for employment are unskilled.
