Manpower stats improve

Manpower statistics for the month of June indicate a marked improvement over placement figures for the month of May and for June of last year.

According to the monthly report on Manpower activities, a total of 240 regular and 55

casual vacancies were filled through the Midland centre and its students offices in Midland and Penetanguishene. In addition, ten vacancies were filled by workers coming in to the area from other centres. The figures represent "quite an improvement", according to manager Don

McNee. At the end of June there were 1213 male and 929 females registered for employment, including 319 male and 189 female students also registered. At the end of the month a total of 111 vacancies remained unfilled. During June, 192 orders

were placed with the Manpower Centres, many for one person, but a considerable number were for more than one. In his report, McNee noted that 12 persons were referred to Canada Manpower Training courses in general upgrading, journalism and news reporting, and business and commerce. Seven new industrial training contracts were approved and a further nine programs have been

recommended for approval. A variety of employers in the Midland CMC area are utilizing this program, some of which are large companies, but many represent small businesses. Any employer seeking further information on the program should contact Bob Rhem, CMC liaison counsellor for the program. Employers in the Midland area

Penetanguishene area are urged to consider the use of students for any work during the summer period. With still two months remaining in the summer, 500 students are still available. Vacancies that were still open at the end of June included waiting persons, press operator, backhoe operator, construction equipment mechanic, cook, motor boat mechanic and manager trainees.
