The location is the Crop Demonstration Area on County Road 11, east of Midhurst. The meeting begins at 7:30 p.m.

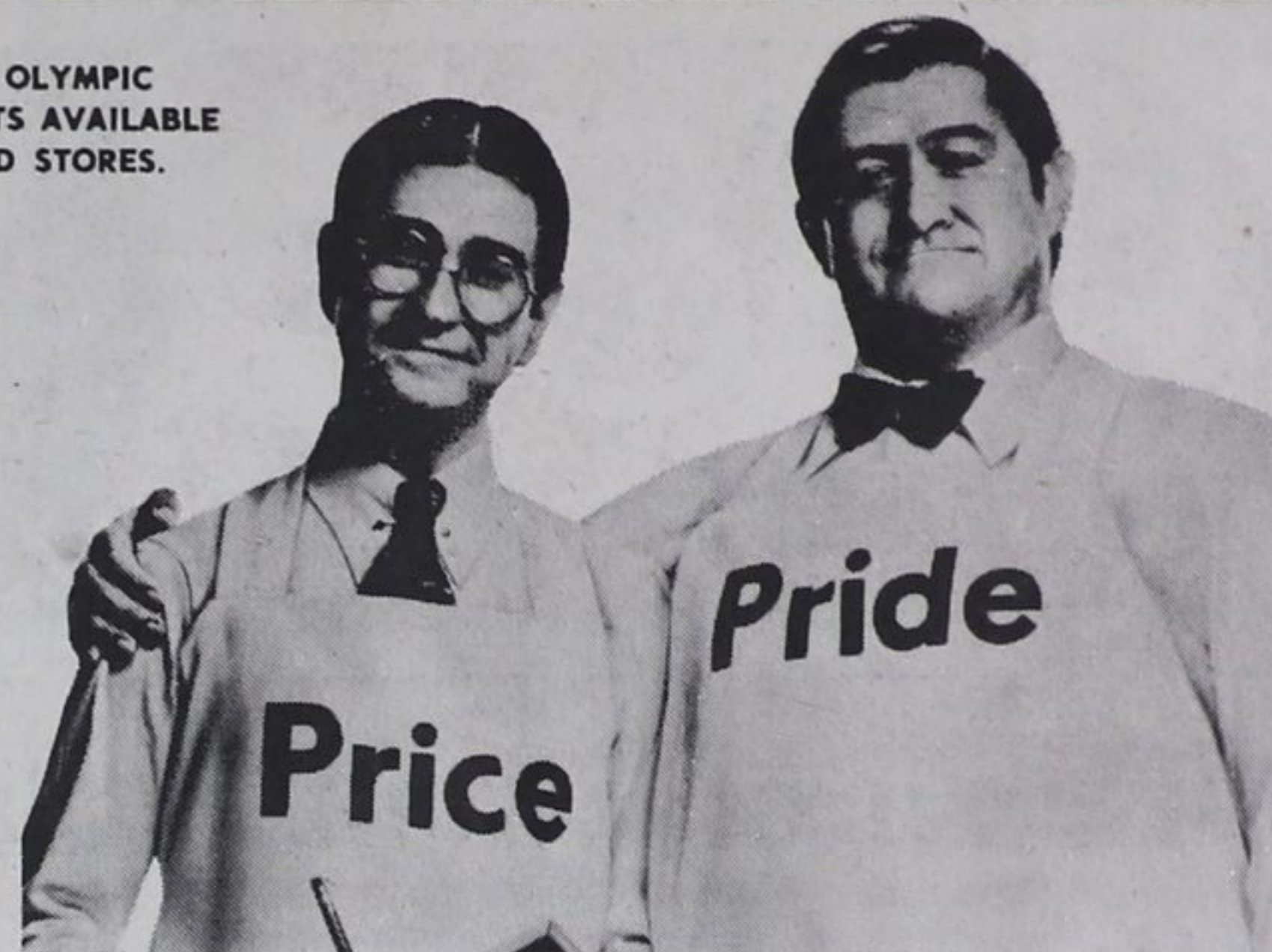
