Georgian College Summer School of the Arts has added a new dimension to its varied and wide-ranging program of summer ceramics instruction. For the first time this year, the excellent ceramic facilities at the college's Barrie campus will be opened for a unique summer school ceramics studio workshop, from July 19 to August 13, with three well-known potters — Roger Kerslake, Ann Mortimer, and Alekx Sorotschynski. In addition the summer school is offering a total of 18 ceramic courses, in ten different locations throughout the Georgian Bay area, including Midland.

The studio workshop has been arranged as a service for area and visiting intermediate and advanced ceramists who wish to practice and produce, partly on their own, during an extended period in the summer. Twice a week specialized instruction will be given and a qualified technician will be on hand at other times.

Summer school director David Phillips explained that many potters have only modest equipment and facilities of their own for throwing, firing, and glazing, which may limit the type and quantity of work they can produce. The college ceramic department on the other hand boasts all the equipment and facilities necessary for work and experimentation in any direction.

Advance registration is required for the studio workshop and enrolment is limited. For further information and registration forms, interested persons should immediately contact Georgian College in Barrie.


