

**Attends sales seminars**

**Manager visits Seattle**

A Penetanguishene businessman spent last weekend in Seattle, Washington attending seminars on sales techniques.

Pete Willson, the manager of the Hindson Marina, which has been under new ownership since mid-April, attended the seminars sponsored by Reinell Boats, a company operating out of Marysville, Washington and Poplar Bluff, Missouri.

Besides attending seminars, Willson, along with other dealers from Canada and the United States, saw a Seafair Reinell hydroplane race, and attended an authentic Indian Salmon Bake on Blake Island in Puget Sound. These special events, which were M.C'd by Charleton Heston, were held to celebrate Reinell's 50th anniversary.

Since taking over management of the marina, Willson has made a number of changes. Besides deciding to carry the Reinell line of boats, he has expanded the docking facilities offered by the marina from space for 80 to 85 boats last summer to space for 175 boats this year. He said that by next year that figure will be increased by another 100. Willson has also increased the staff from a total of three last year, including one mechanic, to four mechanics and one other person.

He said, "I think we've made it into an up and coming business."

**Midland German Canadians present cheque to Chamber**

The German Canadian Club of Midland presented the Penetanguishene Chamber of Commerce with a cheque for \$250 Saturday.

The money represented part of the proceeds of the beerfest held as part of the Chamber of Commerce summerfest in early July. German Canadian Club president Peter Wedel, who presented the cheque to the chairman of the Summerfest Committee, Art Stewart, said "We are regarding the beer garden as a tremendous success."

He said that although the club is not specifically a service club, "we gladly share our profits with the community".

The club was hoping to donate something permanent to the Chamber of Commerce, such as park benches for the waterfront. However, in view of the loss the Chamber took on such free events as the water skiing and kite flying demonstrations, Wedel said he would give them the money and let them do what they want with it.

The German Canadian Club holds a number of events to raise money; they ran a beer garden at

the Summerfest at Balm Beach last weekend. They donate some money to the community and keep some for the land which they are in the process of buying. They need the land to build a club house on, so they can hold more and better activities to make more money for the community.

Wedel said there are between 2,000 and 3,000 people of German descent in the area of the Tiny Tay peninsula and down to Elmvale, but, he said, you don't have to be of German descent to join the club. "We are wide open to anybody."
