

**Canada Pension**

**A few answers**

1. Q. I have recently moved. How do I notify the Canada Pension of a change of address?  
 A. Notification can be submitted by use of regular post office change of address forms or by letter, addressed to the Canada Pension Plan, Department of National Health and Welfare, Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0L1. Please make sure you give your old address, your new address, as well as the social insurance number under which your benefit is being paid. You can also change your address by contacting your nearest Canada Pension Plan district or local office.

2. Q. I get a G.A.I.N.S. cheque from the province of Ontario on or about the middle of each month and wonder if you could tell me what it is for?  
 A. The Ontario Guaranteed Annual Income System (G.A.I.N.S.) administered by the Ministry of Revenue, ensures that qualified residents of Ontario 65 years of age or over receive a monthly income of \$272.07. The Ontario G.A.I.N.S. cheque represents the difference between any income you may have including the Federal Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement and \$272.07 amount Ontario believes you should have as a minimum each month (as of July 1976). This amount may be increased at a later date. At the present time the monthly maximum amount of G.A.I.N.S. for a single person would be \$38.88 and for a married person it would be \$49.65.

3. Q. Can a husband wife both receive a retirement pension under the Canada Pension Plan?  
 A. Yes, providing each has been employed or self employed and contributed individually to the Plan.

4. Q. I am 30 years of age and have been contributing to the Canada Pension plan for the last ten years. I plan on leaving Canada permanently. Can I withdraw my contributions?  
 A. No. The contribution you have made to the Canada Pension Plan will remain to your credit and will offer financial protection to your spouse and children, should you die, and temporary financial protection to you should you become disabled. Also at age 65, you would be entitled to receive a retirement pension irrespective of where you are residing.

5. Q. Are widow's benefits received from the Canada Pension Plan taxable?  
 A. Yes. Generally all benefits paid under the Canada Pension Plan are taxable income.

**Speed limit lowered in Tay subdivision**

Tay Township council will be calling tenders for four thousand tons of screened sand to be delivered and mixed with salt at the township yard. 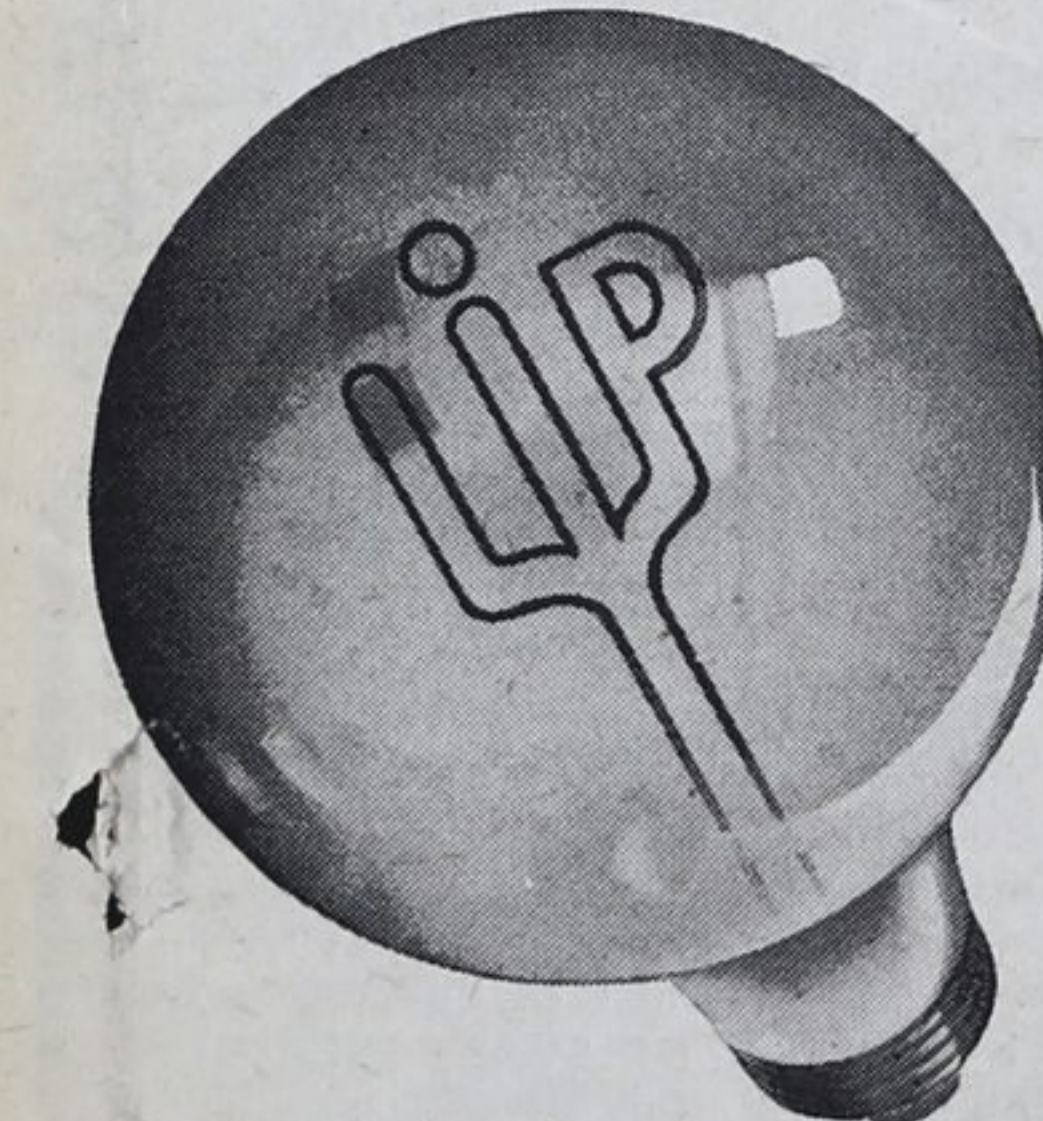
