Special activity day at Establishments

The excitement and colour of authentic 19th century British military pageantry will be featured Saturday, August 21 during a special activity day at the Historic Naval and Military Establishments, Penetanguishene.

Joining the now famous Establishment Guard which has just returned from the historic march from Penetanguishene to Toronto, will be the Fort York Guard, renowned throughout Ontario for its spectacular military shows.

The Fort York Guard represents a Royal Regiment of the 1804-1816 period, dressed in red coats and grey pants. The headgear is a high, stovepit type with tufts on the left side, termed a "Waterloo shako". Each man carries an India Pattern flint-lock musket.

The Establishments Guard will be in the 24th Regiment of Foot Uniform with white trousers and green trim on the red coats. They too will carry the India Pattern "Brown Bess" musket.

The 12-man Establishments Guard and the 14-man Fort York Guard will execute a number of infantry drill including artillery firing of the one-pound field gun, as well as one of the large cannon at the Establishments. Fifes and drums will set the

battle timing.

Shows are scheduled to begin at 1:30 and 3:30 p.m., but that is not all. According to Establishments Manager Burke Penny, this special activity day is an ideal family outing. Not only are there military shows to watch, but a number of other century old activities as well.

There will be pioneer cooking, soap-making, dyeing by natural materials, knot-making

and splicing in the naval storehouse and the Huronia Spinners Guild will demonstrate various methods of spinning wool.

In the Orientation Centre at 12:30 p.m., before the first military show begins, a 40-minute film, "Cooper of Williamsburg", will give visitors a glimpse of famous Williamsburg and one of its craftsmen at work.

On the second storey of the naval storehouse will

be a display of work completed by children who participated in the Establishments Summer Workshop program.

The entire afternoon of activities costs only the regular site admission, charge for adults, 75 cents; students, 50 cents; and children, 25 cents. There are picnic facilities on site for those who wish to take their lunch.

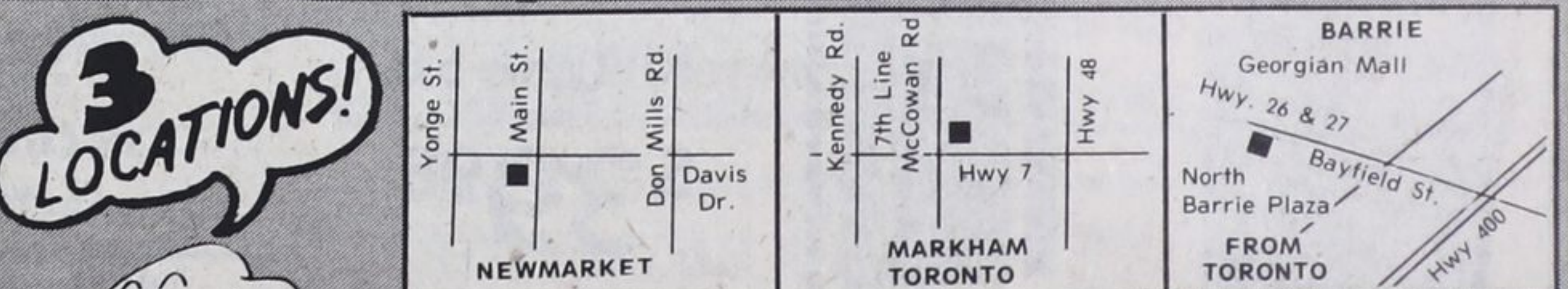
