Midland court

Three month sentence for conviction

Patrick King of Penetanguishene pleaded guilty in provincial court Monday to a charge of impaired driving. This was the third time King had been convicted of impaired driving or excess alcohol. The crown recommended to Judge L.T. Montgomery a minimum sentence of three months in prison because this was the third

offence. King's lawyer said the man is trying to overcome a problem with alcohol which he has had for some time. The judge sentenced the man to three months.

Pleading guilty

Robert Zoschke, 18, of Midland pleaded guilty in provincial court of a charge of impaired driving. Zoschke was

stopped by the police in Midland when involved in a motor vehicle collision with a stationary vehicle. Because he had no previous record he was fined \$175.

Failing to appear

Maurice Boucher, 27, of Penetanguishene pleaded guilty to a charge of failing to appear in court on July 26 in Midland.

Boucher explained he had thought he was to appear several days later in court in Penetanguishene. Judge Montgomery said although this was an excuse it was not a lawful excuse and therefore he fined the man \$100.

Granted conditional discharge

Three Midland youths were granted conditional

discharges from a joint charge of stealing flags from Beaver Lumber Limited in Midland. The three unlawfully stole four flags from the front of the building on the night of August 21. Kenneth Boyd, 17, David Longlade, 18, and Todd Morely, 17, pleaded guilty to the charge but were granted the discharge because of their age and the nature of the offence.

Excess alcohol

Danny Carson, 27 of Midland was fined \$150 in provincial court Monday after pleading guilty to a charge of excess alcohol.

Four other people were convicted on impaired driving in court Thursday.

Christine Pirie of Midland was convicted on two counts of impaired driving, one arising out of an incident on August 7, and the other on August 15. She was given a fine of \$125 on the first conviction, and the mandatory 15 days in jail on the second.

Celestin Lesperance, 53, of Midland, pleaded guilty to charges of impaired driving and refusing to provide a sample of his breath. He was given 15 days in jail on the first charge, mandatory because of a previous impaired driving conviction, and a

\$250 fine on the charge of refusing to provide a sample.

Siegfried Detamble, 29, was convicted of impaired driving as a result of being stopped on Highway 12 east of Victoria Harbour on May 30. He was given a breathalyzer test which showed an alcohol level of 180 milligrams per 100 millilitres of blood. He was given a fine of \$200.

Larry Schleuter, 34, of Midland, was handed a \$175 fine for impaired driving as a result of a .180 reading on a breathalyzer test taken after he was stopped while driving westbound on highway 12 outside Port McNicoll on July 8.
