**Season ends for Naval and Military Establishments**

The Historic Naval and Military Establishments closed its doors to the public at 6:00 Monday, but for many of the people who worked there over the summer, the season is far from over.

While a few staffers remain at the site to conduct the Harvest Home program, a program which introduces children from grades two to six to many aspects of pioneer life, still others are joining with some of the staffers from St. Marie among the Hurons to man an exhibit at the London Fall Fair in London, Ontario.

such things as spinning, dyeing wool, cooking and candle dipping, will run from September 20 to October 8.

Still further into the winter, the staff are hoping to run a Christmas program similar to the one which was held last year. It would include an open house, sleigh riding and caroling.

Over the summer, about 9,500 people toured the Establishments, including a number of senior citizens' groups, groups from camps in the area, and one group of Japanese Buddhists from Toronto.

The season was a successful one for the members of the staff with

highlights including Toronto actress Pauline Carey's dramatization of the diary of Anna Jameson, written during her 1837 visit to Upper Canada, the visit in early June by the members of the 48th Highlanders Cadet Corps, the evening open house at the end of July, in which the buildings were all lit by candles, and the march of the Establishments guard to Fort York in August.

As well, the Establishments ran a series of walking tours of Penetanguishene, held Sunday mornings throughout August. About 70 people took advantage of the tours, with about 40 participating on one busy

Sunday. Still another successful program run at the site was the children's workshop, held in August, in which local children had a chance to experience pioneer living. While 48 children registered for the program, about 65 attended the workshops before they were over.

The Establishments opened its doors May 22 in this its fourth summer of operation. Its staff includes 24 interpretive staff, 12 men who dressed as guards and sailors and 12 women who led the tours, four archeologists, and four students working at the site as part of an

Opportunities for Youth program. The site is operated by the Ministry of Culture and Recreation, which also operates Ste. Marie among the Hurons and Old Fort William.

For those who missed out on the historic site this year, and for those who wish to go again, the

Historic Naval and Military Establishments will open again next year in late May.
