

Sentenced to 30 days in jail

A Penetanguishene man was sentenced to 30 days in jail after pleading guilty in provincial court Monday to a charge of driving while his licence

was under suspension. This was the third conviction on this kind of offence for 44-year-old Yves Kirouac of Penetanguishene.

Kirouac was charged on July 5 in Midland after being stopped by the Midland police on 4th Street. Judge L.T. Montgomery said he felt he had no other choice but to sentence Kirouac to a short period of incarceration.

"You have shown disregard for this law on three different occasions," he said. Kirouac will serve his 30 days on an intermittent basis.

Remanded for sentencing
Two Midland youths were remanded to October 25 for sentencing pending the receipt of a pre-sentence report.

Peter Spahr, 16, of 722 Montreal Street and Jonny Kranz, 16, of Old Fort Road were jointly charged on September 15 on one count of theft under \$200 and another of attempted theft. The two, accompanied by a juvenile, were ap-

prehended in Cuning-Nicholson Shoe Store after stealing a pair of running shoes from the store. They had stolen a pair of shoes from another store shortly before.

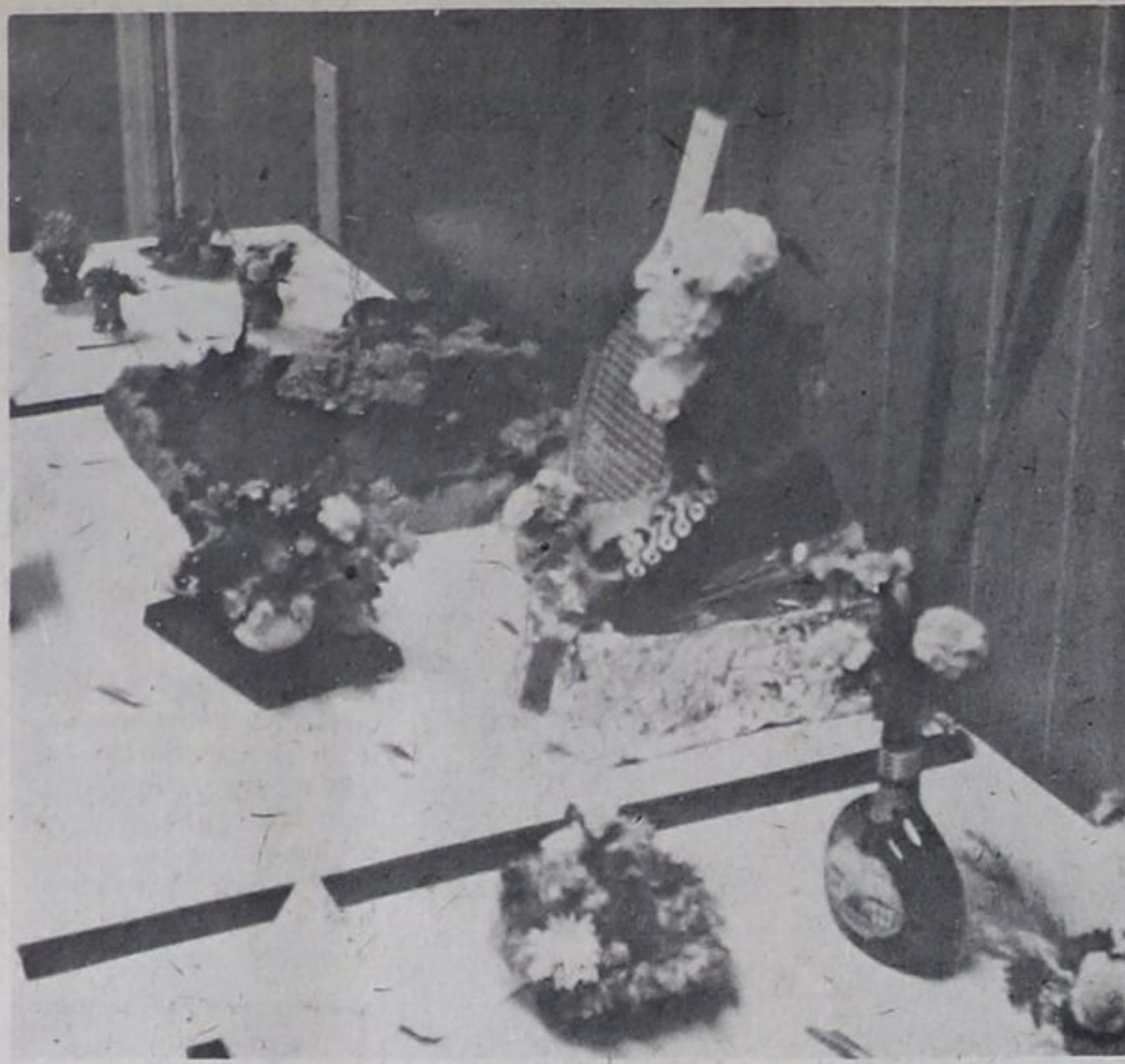
Judge Montgomery said he felt a pre-sentence report would be in order before sentencing the youths.

Granted discharge
Lee Wesley Stevens, 37, of Victoria Harbour was granted a conditional discharge after pleading guilty to a charge of theft under \$200.

Stevens was charged on September 11 in Midland with stealing a transistor radio from the Canadian Tire Store on Bay Street.

Fined \$300
Melbourne Evans, 34, of Port McNicoll was fined \$300 Monday in provincial court on conviction of impaired driving.

Evans pleaded guilty to the charge which was laid on August 31 in Midland.
