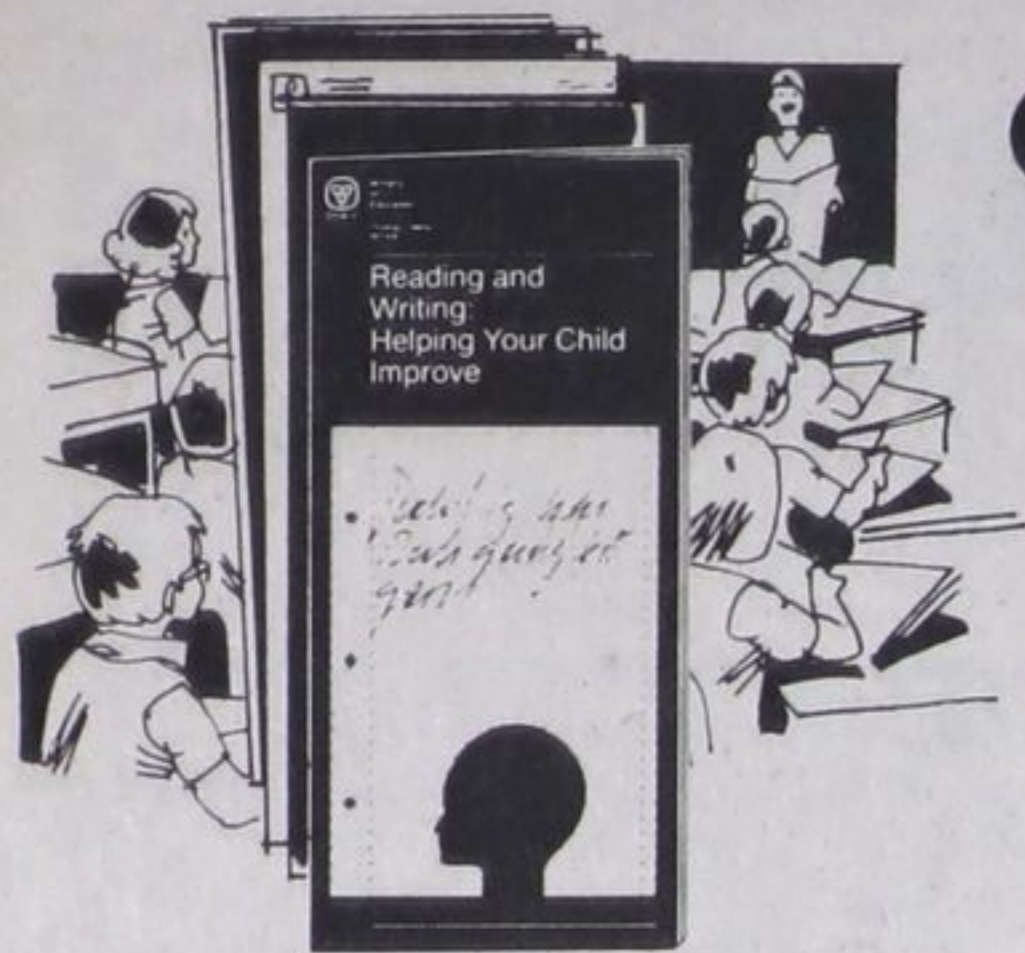


Canadian Cancer Society has important message to tell

Mrs. Juanita Rourke, Midland, and Mrs. Shirley Mills, Penetanguishene, Canadian Cancer Society Education Chairmen, recently participated in a two-day education conference at the Prince Hotel, Toronto. Along with 300 other CCS volunteers, the delegates attended workshops conducted by professional health consultants and teachers. Discussions included cancer education materials available to people in the community and the most effective way to use this material to educate the public about cancer safeguards.

"The Canadian Cancer Society has an important message to tell," said Mrs. Rourke. "But in this age of mass information it is at times difficult to be heard. Our message is quite simple. All we're asking is that people practise 'Seven Steps to Health!'"

"The Canadian Cancer Society has a wide variety of learning materials available free of charge for schools, clubs and any other interested organizations," Mrs. Mills reported. VILLAGE OF PORT McNICOLL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Preliminary List of Electors

A preliminary list of eligible electors has been prepared by enumeration for the Municipal Election.

This electors list is to be used for the election of members of council Public Utilities Commission and members of the Simcoe County Board of Education.

Posting of Elector's List

On October 22nd 1976 copies of the electors list will be posted in the Municipal Offices of the Village of Port McNicoll 3rd St.

Qualification of Electors

A is a resident in the Municipality.
B A Canadian Citizen or other British Subject.
C At least 18 years of age before Dec. 6th 1976. A resident in the Municipality between 7th Sept. and 12th Oct. / 76. You and your spouse can also vote in a Municipality where you are not residents if you own or rent property in that municipality.

All electors are asked to examine the list for the purpose of making additions or corrections to or deletion of the list.

Revision of Elector's List

Applications in the nature of requests for additions or correction to or deletions from the list may be made during office hours by an elector completing and filing a form obtainable at the office of the Clerk.

The last day for filing forms requesting additions corrections or deletions is November 5th 1976.

A few answers

1. Q. I became 65 in December 1975, but have been retired since June, 1975. Will I be eligible for a retirement pension the month following my 65th birthday or the month following my retirement? I have not applied for a retirement pension as of today, S.M., Port Severn.

A. Neither. Prior to age 70, a retirement pension is payable on the month following the month you apply. (For a person over 70, it would be payable, upon application, the month following your 70th birthday but could not be paid retroactively for more than twelve months.)

2. Q. I am a pensioner living in an apartment for which I pay \$175.00 per month. I have a friend who owns her own home. Why should she get more Guaranteed Income Supplement than I do? R.V., Midland.

A. The Guaranteed Income Supplement is calculated on income claimed for income tax purposes. Personal possessions are not considered for supplement purposes unless they are producing income such as in a situation where a person rented a portion of her home. If she should sell her home and earn interest from the money received from a mortgage, this income would be counted for supplement purposes.

3. Q. I was born in Italy on October 17, 1908. I came to Canada on June 16, 1962. I have been told that I might be eligible to receive Old Age Security but I have not applied as I am not a Canadian citizen. Am I correct? A.D., Elmvale.

A. It is not necessary for a person to be a Canadian citizen in order to qualify for Old Age Security. As eligibility is based on age and residence, it would appear that you may qualify at the present time. I would suggest that you make an application for Old Age Security as soon as possible to avoid any further loss of benefits.

4. Q. Are Old Age Security benefits taxable? R.C., Midland.

A. Yes. The amount of Old Age Security shown on the Income Tax Return is the maximum that should be reported if you received it for the entire taxation year, unless a retroactive payment covering an earlier period has been received in which case the full amount is taxable. In 1975 the amount shown on the Income Tax Return for Old Age Security was \$1,495.56. Note that this amount does not include benefits received from the Guaranteed Income Supplement which, in general, is not taxable.

5. Q. I am drawing my retirement pension from the Canada Pension Plan and I am still working. Do I contribute to Canada Pension Plan and Unemployment Insurance coverage? B.N., Victoria Harbour.

A. No.
6. I am a 25-year old female who has paid into the Canada Pension Plan for six years and plan to be married and may not return to the labour market in the future. Is there any way I can have my contributions returned to me? D.O., Penetang.

A. No. Contributions cannot be returned, but you will be eligible for a retirement pension at age 65, upon application, based on those earnings.

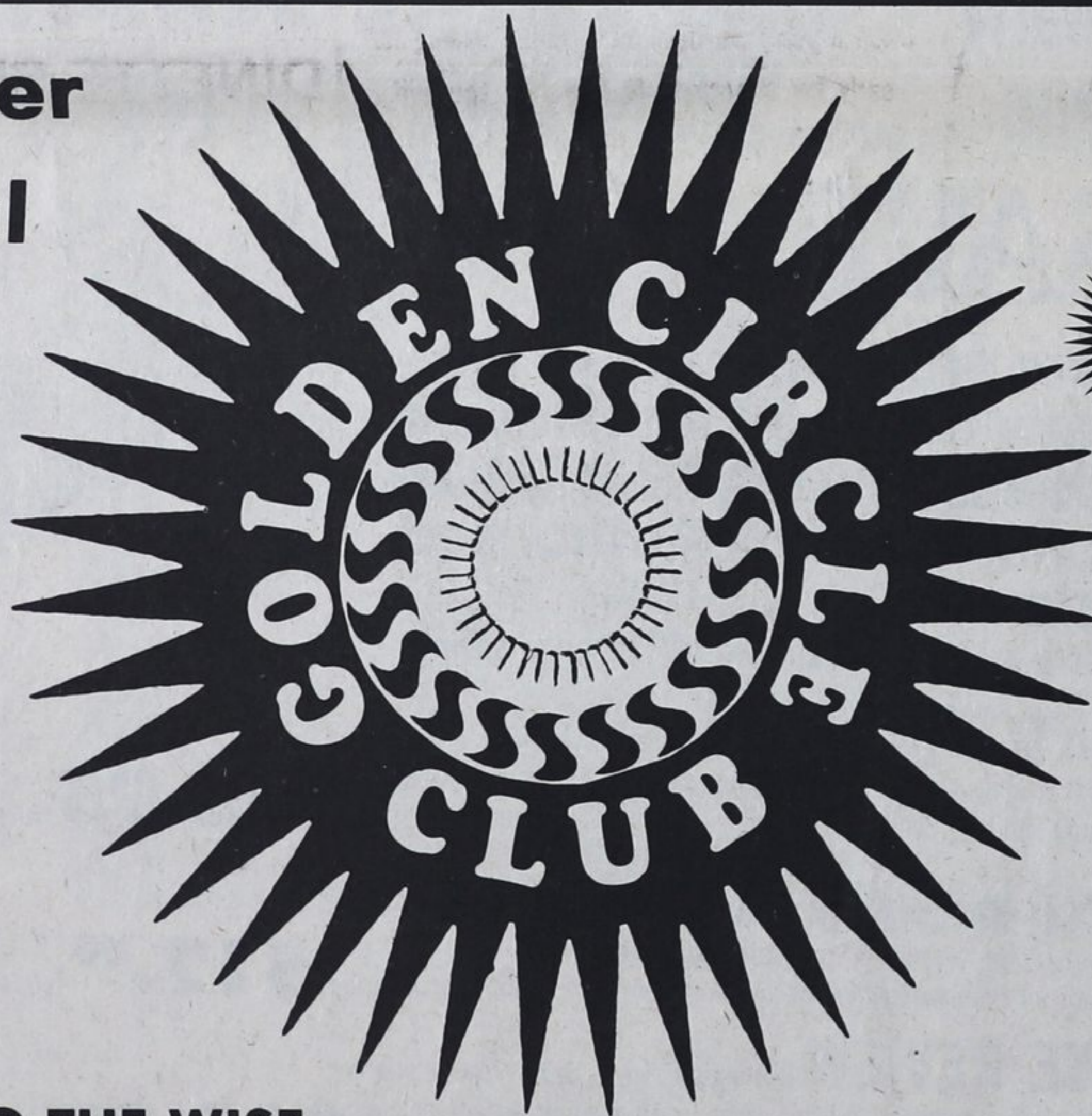
