Library gets money

The Penetanguishene Public Library has received a grant of \$2,750 from Wintario. The money will be spent on Canadian books, and new shelving.

Town clerk Yvon Gagne said last week the original offer made by council had no strings attached, but admitted that at the time the offer was made there was never any question but that the facility would be built in Penetanguishene.

Since the offer was only good under the 1976 budget, it would have to be discussed by the new council, and repassed in next year's budget, where the problem could lie.

However, he said he thought there would not be any problem. He said the group had been looking in Penetanguishene and had

not found anywhere suitable. He said the town could not offer them land in the waterfront park area, because he added that the town really couldn't complain about the new choice of location if it couldn't offer a better site within the town.

He said the new chosen location is only a half mile from the town, and pointed out that there are close links between the town and township. The corporation has been searching for an appropriate parcel of land since last June at which time it was decided

that the location they had been looking at, the White House, was not suitable. A large part of the Corporation's task still lies ahead, as finance committee chairman Rejeanne Galbraith pointed out last week.

She said the group now has to have architect's drawings made up, and said as yet they have not chosen an architect. At the same time, they are getting ready to launch their fund raising campaign, which has been in the works since early this summer.

Their plan is to get a concept ready to present to the people and then begin a massive mail campaign covering all businesses, land owners, and residents in the area, as well as cottage owners who live out of the area, and other people who would have an interest in seeing an educational facility built in Penetanguishene. On top of that, they hope to get a large grant percentage of their funding in the form of a grant from Wintario.

The Council was established by the Minister of Natural Resources to assist the Government in the preparation of a recreational trails programme. This Council is an autonomous group composed of members of the public who represent hiking, snowmobiling, bicycling, cross-country skiing, canoeing, motorized trail bike and horseback riding interests. The Council also includes memberships from trail related interests such as private individuals, conservationists and agriculturalists.

The purpose of this public meeting is to receive briefs and to hold informal discussions with all interested individuals and groups. The Trails Council actively seeks the support of the public in the identification of present issues, conflicts, and solutions to the development of a Provincial Trails Programme.

The amount of time allocated for each presentation will be governed by the total number of briefs submitted. If more than one brief is presented, the brief presenter will be requested that only one brief per organization or person be presented.
