Fish Rolls (North Atlantic

Seafood Association) 2 lbs. North Atlantic frozen cod fillets, cooked and flaked.

- 1/2 cup onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup long grain rice, cooked
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. paprika 16 large cabbage leaves, blanched 3 minutes.
- Sauce, Part 1 1/4 cup butter

1 can (11/2 ounces) tomato paste

- 1/4 cup lemon juice 2 tsp. sugar
- Spice bag 6 peppercorns, 1 bayleaf

1 can (7½ ounces tomato sauce)

- 3 tbsp onions, chopped
- 3 tbsp butter 3 tbsp flour

1 tsp salt Method: Combine cooked fish, onions, cooked

rice and seasonings. Use 1/3 cup per roll. Fill each cabbage leaf and fold sides to form package. Secure with toothpicks. Prepare sauce, Part 1, by melting butter and

adding all the listed ingredients for Part 1. Bring to boiling point. Reduce heat. Place rolls in sauce. Cover and simmer 15 minutes. Remove spice bag and rolls from tomato

sauce. Take out the toothpicks and keep the rolls warm. Reserve sauce. Prepare Sauce Part 2. Fry onions in melted butter. Add flour and salt and mix to form a

paste. Spoon into reserved tomato sauce. Cook until thickened and serve over hot fish rolls. That sounds a rather complicated routine, and it is not recommended for a quick supper at the end of a hairy day. But for a night when you feel creative, and patriotic, you can create six


