

Proxy Voting

Any person whose name is entered in the Polling List for a Polling Subdivision or who has obtained a Certificate from the Clerk entitling him to vote and who is:

(1) A person who is certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner by Certificate filed with the Clerk to be physically incapable of attending a polling place; (2) A person absent from his regular residence by reason of attending an educational institution and who is entered in the list for the Polling Subdivision in which he normally resides, and who expects by reason of such absence to be unable to vote at the Advance Poll or on Polling Day; or

(3) A person who expects to be absent from his Polling Subdivision during the election period, including the Advance Poll and Polling Day, by reason of his being engaged for hire or reward in the business of transportation by railway, air, water or motor vehicle; may vote by proxy in that Polling Subdivision.

Any person who is entitled to vote by proxy may appoint in writing in the prescribed form as his voting proxy may appoint in writing in the prescribed form as his voting proxy a person who is entitled to vote in Midland.

A voting proxy may not act as a voting proxy for more than one person voting by proxy, except where the person voting by proxy is the parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, brother, sister, husband or wife of the voting proxy, in which case a voting proxy may act for more than one person voting by proxy. An appointment of a person as a voting proxy is not valid unless it is made after Nomination Day

A Municipal Elector May Only Vote Once

The Municipal Elections Act prevents against duplicate voting by legislating that any municipal elector is allowed to vote only once, and that must be in the Ward in which he has his principal place of residence regardless of how much property he owns in other wards of the Municipality. Ownership or tenancy of land or buildings in two or more wards in a single Municipality does not permit an elector to vote in each Ward. An elector can only vote where his name is or he is entitled to be on the voters' list and his name can only be on a voters' list in the ward in which he maintains his principal place of residence. (Municipal Elections Act, Section 47).

Explanatory Note

This is an Explanatory Note in connection with the Ontario Municipal Board's Appointment for Hearing set for December 13th, 1976.

In November 1974 an Official Plan for the Town of Penetanguishene, which designated areas for future land use, was approved by the Minister of Housing. The next step in the planning process was to implement the policies of the Official Plan by means of a zoning

Zoning By-law 1975-20 was passed by Council on April 29th, 1975. As a result of information received, an amendment was found necessary, specifically with respect to a reduction in ground floor area

requirements for certain zones. This amendment was passed on July 28th, 1975, as By-law 1975-44, and after its first publication in September 1975, public meetings

The Ontario Municipal Board has now established a hearing date for the purpose of hearing any and all parties interested in supporting or opposing either one of these by-laws. Notice of the hearing is being specifically mailed to all persons who lodged objections with the municipality, to the local Planning Boards, and is being published in the local newspaper to give this information to the ratepayers as a whole in the municipality.


