Proxy Voting
 Any person whose name is entered in the Polling List for a Polling Subdivision or who has obtained a Certificate from the Clerk entitling him to vote and who is:

- (1) A person who is certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner by Certificate filed with the Clerk to be physically incapable of attending a polling place;
- (2) A person absent from his regular residence by reason of attending an educational institution and who is entered in the list for the Polling Subdivision in which he normally resides, and who expects by reason of such absence to be unable to vote at the Advance Poll or on Polling Day; or
- (3) A person who expects to be absent from his Polling Subdivision during the election period, including the Advance Poll and Polling Day, by reason of his being engaged for hire or reward in the business of transportation by railway, air, water or motor vehicle; may vote by proxy in that Polling Subdivision.

Any person who is entitled to vote by proxy may appoint in writing in the prescribed form as his voting proxy a person who is entitled to vote in Midland.

A voting proxy may not act as a voting proxy for more than one person voting by proxy, except where the person voting by proxy is the parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, brother, sister, husband or wife of the voting proxy, in which case a voting proxy may act for more than one person voting by proxy.

An appointment of a person as a voting proxy is not valid unless it is made after Nomination Day (November 15th), and does not remain in force after Polling Day (December 6th).

A person who has been appointed a voting proxy may apply to the Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. Tuesday Nov. 30th., 1976, to receive a Certificate to vote by proxy. (Municipal Elections Act, Section 65).

A Municipal Elector May Only Vote Once
 The Municipal Elections Act prevents against duplicate voting by legislating that any municipal elector is allowed to vote only once, and that must be in the Ward in which he has his principal place of residence regardless of how much property he owns in other wards of the Municipality. Ownership or tenancy of land or buildings in two or more wards in a single Municipality does not permit an elector to vote in each Ward. An elector can only vote where his name is or he is entitled to be on the voters' list and his name can only be on a voters' list in the ward in which he maintains his principal place of residence. (Municipal Elections Act, Section 47).
