I believe in open, responsive local government, solving problems in a reasonable, commonsense way.

New ideas and new approaches to old problems are needed on Midland Council. Midland is faced with a difficult time for the next two years in building a new arena-community centre. This is going to require vigorous and efficient leadership. I am con-

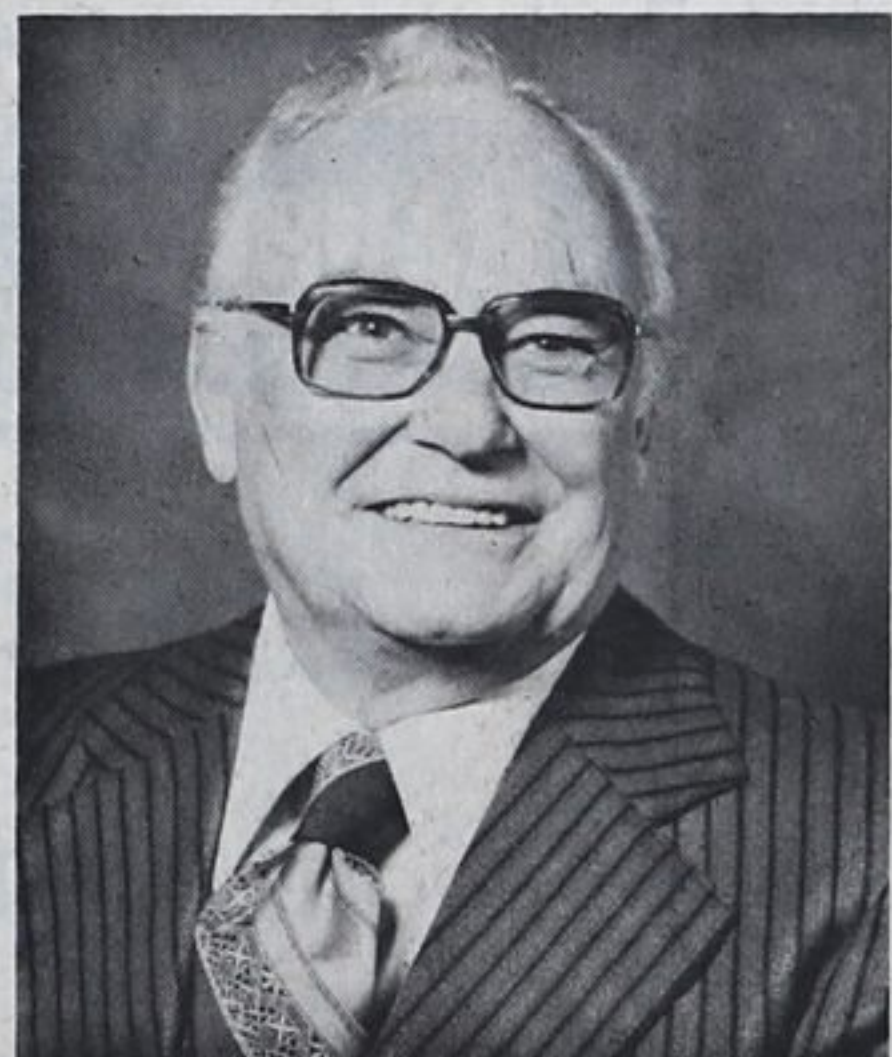
