The death occurred at the Mississauga Hospital in Toronto on November 27, of Dr. Kenneth McKnight.

He was 47.

Dr. McKnight graduated in medicine from the University of Western Ontario in 1955, and specialized in psychiatry. He spent six years as assistant Superintendent of the Mental Health Centre at Penetanguishene where he continued his interest in the assessment and treatment of offenders.

Manpower reports more vacancies filled

The job vacancy picture improved somewhat last month in the Midland-Penetanguishene area with the Midland Canada Manpower Center reporting an increase in the number of vacancies filled.

A total of 114 vacancies, 77 male and 37 female were filled by local recruiters in November; in addition, Midland Manpower also filled 26 casual vacancies.
