# A win, a tie and a loss for the Flyers

The Midland-Penetanguishene Flyers took a tough schedule on the weekend, and came away with three points.

Flyers won at home against the Barrie Colts Friday night, travelled to Orillia for a match Saturday night that ended in a tie, and ran into a hot Colts goaltender Sunday night as they lost to Barrie.

Friday nights 5-2 Flyer win was perhaps their best game of the season.

"We should have been ahead 5-0 at the end of the first period," said owner Ron Sauve. Flyers out-shot Barrie 18-4 in the first 20 minutes with Rene Peltier giving the home

team a 2-0 lead. Peltier's goals came 13 seconds apart, the first on an unassisted effort.

Both teams were flying in the second and third periods. Hefty checks were dished out from both teams, one such smash nearly sent Gary Hansford right over the boards. That check was in retaliation for Hansford's second period goal where he was set up all alone in front of Colts' goaltender Hal Hake by Larry Fallon.

Flyer fans received a scare early in the third period as Barrie struck for two goals inside of three minutes. Jamie Laws and Mark Gillanders were the goal

scorers and the Colts were within one of tying it.

The Flyers didn't fold as they would have earlier in the season. They kept pressing jumping on the puck at every occasion and forcing turnovers. The strategy paid off as Rene Peltier potted his third goal of the night from a scramble in front of the Barrie net. Larry Trotter got his first goal as a Flyer six minutes later off a shot from the faceoff

circle.

An injury and a stalled car resulted in Flyers missing a chance for a win Saturday night at Orillia.

The Travelways scored twice with less than three minutes to go in the game to salvage a 6-6 tie with the Flyers. Neil Parker and Rob Jackson didn't make the game because of car troubles and Larry Trotter injured his knee, resulting in the Flyers going with two forward lines for most of the

game.

The action wasn't as fast moving as in Friday's game because of the leg weariness of the Flyers.

John Beauchamp with the hat trick, Hansford with two and Trotter with a single, were the goal scorers for Midland.

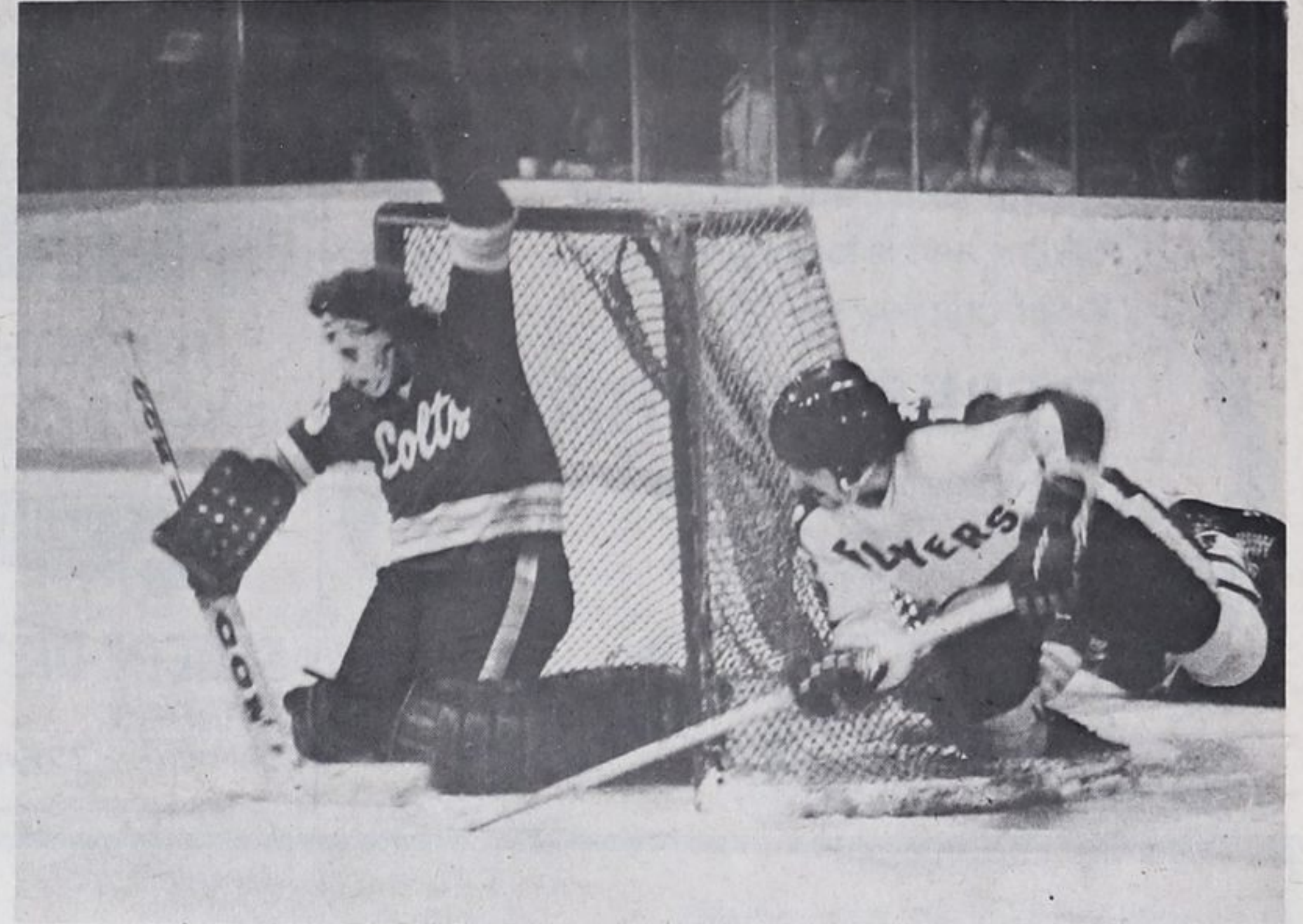
Midland scored the first goal Sunday night in Elmvale but Barrie responded with two and proceeded to beat the understandably sluggish Flyers 4-3.

A good-sized crowd

turned up in Elmvale to cheer on their adopted team. Manager Red Urquhart said they could be seating 500 people if the Flyers played regularly in Elmvale, opposed to the less than 200 that make it out for games in Penetanguishene.

Beauchamp continued his scoring streak with two goals, Tim Merkely in his second game as a Flyer netted a single goal.

Flyers face the Colts again this Friday in Barrie.

## Juveniles demolish Stayner 10-3, Neil, Chapman score two each

The Penetanguishene Juveniles hockey team picked up another victory over the weekend. This time they defeated the team from Stayner by a score of 10-3.

The Juveniles started off the game, played here in town Sunday afternoon, with a bang. By the end of the first period, they were leading 6-0. The goals were scored by Pat Duquette, Mike Orser,

Ray Cote, Greg Arbour, Ken Cowan and John St. Amant, with assists going to Aime Gignac, Ken Marchildon, Paul Lefaive, Arbour, and Marshall Lesperance.

About half way through the second period, Stayner got on the scoreboard on a goal by Bart Chapman, assisted by Ronnie MacDonald. The goal was answered about five minutes later

with two quick goals in a row by Jamie Neil. He was assisted on both goals by Cote.

The two teams traded goals in the third period, as Chapman scored his second of the afternoon, from Jim Lowe and Allen Lowe. Ken Marchildon answered for Penetanguishene, assisted by Neil, and Allen Lowe scored unassisted for Stayner. Marchildon

got the last goal for Penetanguishene, assisted by Ken Parent, with nearly four minutes left in the game.

The Penetanguishene squad picked up eight penalties during the game, as opposed to six for Stayner.

With the Juvenile schedule exactly half over, the Penetanguishene team has played eight games, won five, lost one and tied two. They have scored 54 goals, while only letting in 27.

The top scorer on the team is Paul Lefaive, with 16 points in eight games, on eight goals and eight assists. Jamie Neil is second in the scoring race with nine goals and four assists for 13 points, and Ray Cote and Pat Duquette have 10 points a piece. Aime Gignac has nine points, while Larry Cowan, Greg Arbour and Mike Orser each have seven. Martin Quigley has five points, and Ken Marchildon, Ken Parent, Grant Quesnelle and Marshall Lesperance all have four points. John St. Amant, who has only played in one game for the Juveniles, having started the season with Flyers, has one point.

The team goes to Collingwood tomorrow night, and plays host to Meaford Sunday afternoon.

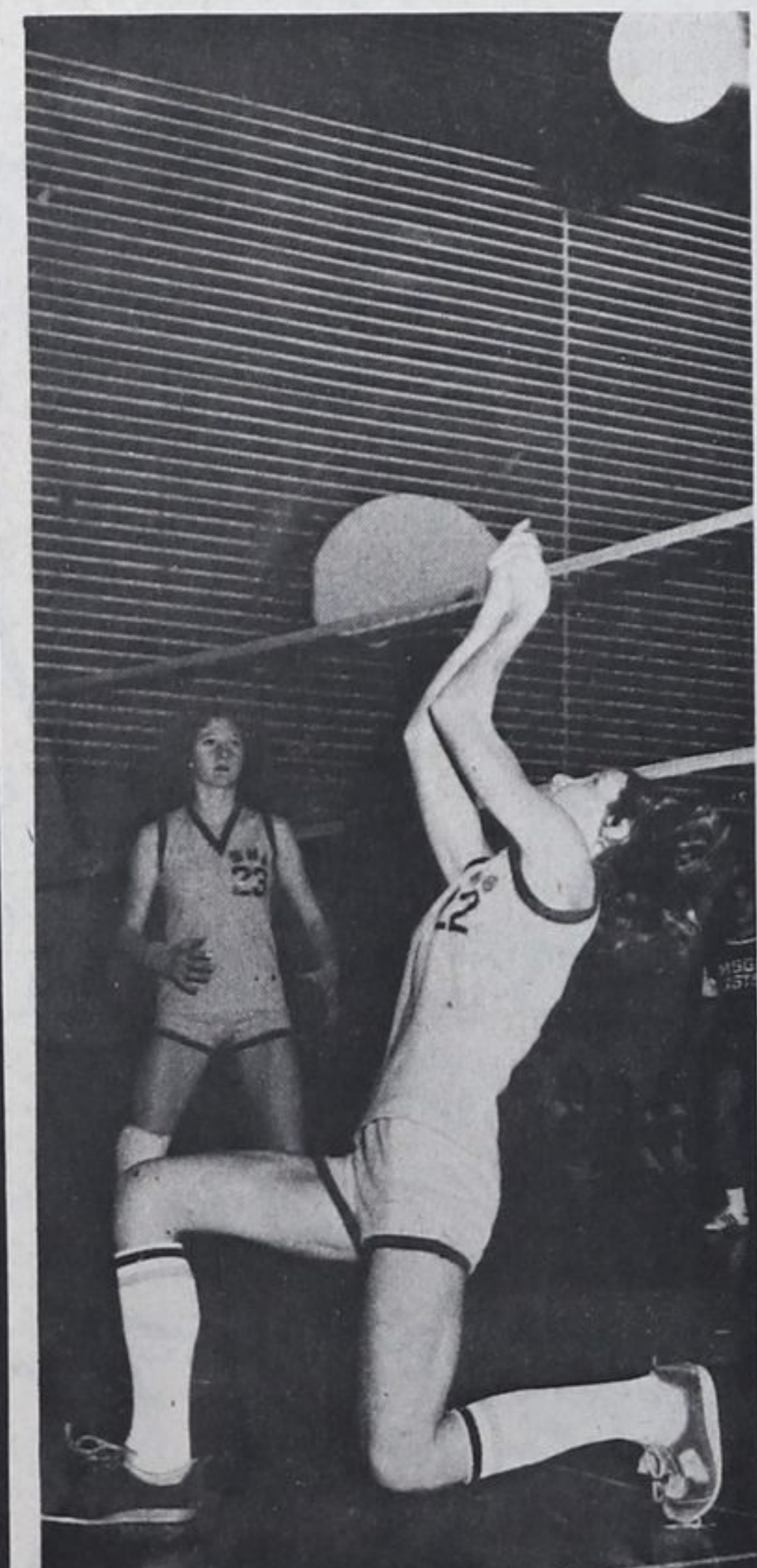
