The guest speaker, Harry Rowlands, executive director, Ontario Division, was introduced by Jim

Malcolm. In his interesting address, Mr. Rowlands pointed out that more people have died of cancer than in all the wars in history. The Canadian Cancer Society is a National organization, with the Ontario Division working under that umbrella. But, said Mr. Rowlands, the real Cancer Society is not division headquarters but the people in small units like Midland, working all over the province. There are 140,000 actively involved in Ontario alone.

He was proud to relate that the Ontario Division has had requests from New York and Paris, France for the educational programs "Celly" and the teaching-learning kits for Grades 4-6. Visitors from Paris in August requested this material to be shipped to Paris for an upcoming conference.
