## Ken's Esso ends season in first place, downs Emery's Electric in last game

Ken's Esso ended its season with a victory Sunday morning, to assure itself a first place finish in the Penetanguishene Recreational Hockey League. The team downed

Emery's Electric 4-3 in the final game of the season.

Emery's Electric came back from being down 2-1 half way through the second period to lead 3-2

going into the third, but Ken's Esso wrapped it up with two unanswered goals in the third period.

Scoring for Ken's Esso were Paul Loughran, Jim Pollard, Don Maurice and Rick Desjardins. The Emery's Electric scorers were Rick Duval, Bill Couling and Art Desroches.

In the second game of the morning, Hindson Marine won its third game of the season, as the squad edged B. and J. Gas Bar 3-2.

B. and J. scored the first and last goals of the game, but it was the three in between, scored by Hindson Marine, which told the story.

Hindson Marine scorers were Peter DuBeau, Paul Henry, and Paul Dion. Paul McDonald and Terry Dahmer got the B. and J. markers.

With the regular season now over, Ken's Esso winds up in first place with 27 points, three in front of B. and J. Gas Bar. Emery's Electric is in third with 21, and Hindson Marine is in last, a spot they have held all season, with eight.

Ken's Esso players hold down the two top spots in the league scoring race, as Peter Arbour is in the top spot with 33 points, and Paul Loughran is in second place with 27. Dennis Lemieux, of

Emery's Electric, and Martin McNamara of Ken's Esso each have 25 points, and Rick Duval has 24. Three players, Bill Arbour and Rick Desjardins, both of Ken's Esso, and Ken Poppel, of Emery's Electric, are tied for sixth spot with 23 points. Brian Merkley, of B. and J., and Bill Klug, of Emery's Electric, each have 21 and Don Maurice, of Ken's Esso, has 20. Greg Quesnelle and Bill McIntosh, both of B. and J., have 19 points, and Roger Dusome and Larry Leroux, both of Hindson Marine, have 17 apiece.

In the goal tending department, B. and J. Gas Bar's Wayne Carrigan leads the league with a 2.90 goals against per game average, and one shut-out. Wayne Dupuis, of Ken's Esso, has a 3.40 goals against average with one shut-out, and Ted Mason, of Emery's Electric has a 3.55 average with two shut-outs. Gary Ronald, of Hindson Marine, has a 5.25 average.

The semi-finals of the playoffs get underway this Sunday, as last place Hindson Marine takes on second place B. and J., while third place Emery's Electric tries to eliminate first place Ken's Esso. The first game starts at 9:30 a.m. at the Penetanguishene Arena.

Midland-Penetanguishene Flyers said their farewells to the OHA Jr. B season Friday night, and to coach Ed Dorion. "I really don't think I'll be back next year," Dorion said after his team closed the season with a 7-5 win over Barrie Colts. "I enjoyed being with the players," he added, and most of the players said they enjoyed working with the coach. Some felt it was Dorion who was responsible for turning the team around after their 14 game winless streak with Larry

Banks behind the bench. The fact that he may be moving from Midland next season and the amount of time involved were factors in his decision not to coach again.

The Flyers came out steaming in the first period, determined to prove they deserved to be in the playoffs. Barrie needed to win in order to avoid powerful Oak Ridges in the first round of the playoffs. The loss, combined with Orillia's win Saturday night, relegated Barrie to fourth

spot in the standings and meant that Oak Ridges would indeed be their opposition.

Oak Ridges finished the season with 65 points, Thornhill 41, Orillia 38, Barrie, 37, Owen Sound 27 and Midland 24. Five weeks ago Flyers were only two points behind Orillia in fourth spot but the team faltered during a stretch when they played six games in eight nights.

Flyers had built up a 7-1 lead by the midway point of the game. The final score should have been

Numerous stiff checks highlighted the latter portion of the contest, including one steamrolling bump off the hip of usually sedate John Beauchamp. Tempers at the Midland bench were naturally hot as Barrie players were overheard boasting, "I'm in the playoffs and you're not."

Colts will also know what it's like to be out of action shortly because their loss to Midland puts them in an unenviable position in the first round of the playoffs.
