Midland man gets fine following excess alcohol conviction

A 43-year-old Orillia man pleaded guilty in provincial court last Thursday to a charge of excess alcohol.

Thomas Parish was charged after he was seen driving through a stop sign at the corner of Front and Queen Streets in Orillia. He then continued on, weaving along the road.

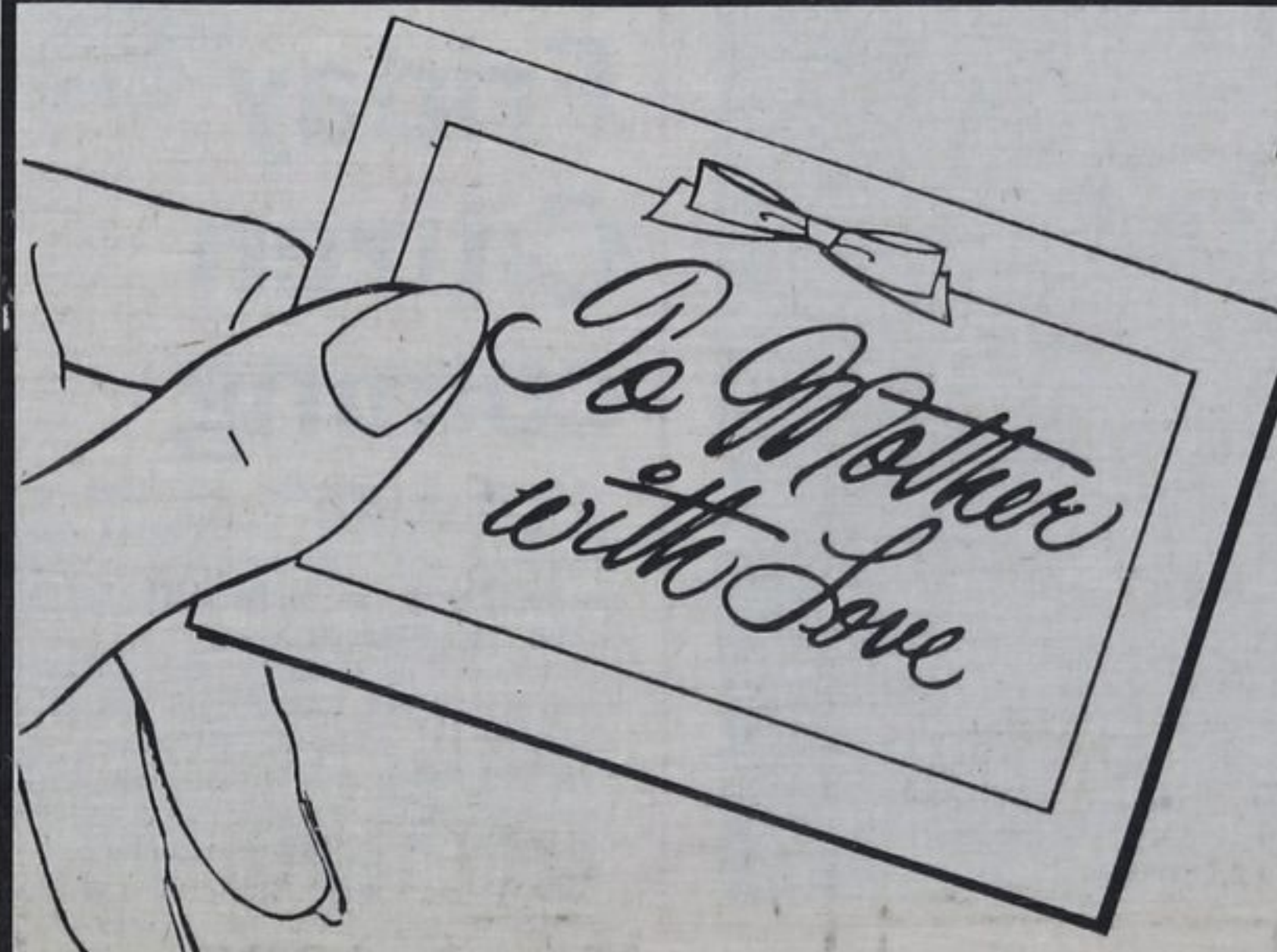
