Rape topic of discussion at Mental Health Centre

you were threatened by a rapist? How would you react? What could you do to prevent it? Would you report it to the police? What could you expect in the courts if you did?

These were some of the questions dealt with in a film and panel discussion held by the Affirmative Action Committee at the enetanguishene Mental alth Centre last Thursday night.

consisted of Mrs. Ann Parker, who organized the panel, Constable Chuck Coulson, of the Ontario Provincial Police, Midland Detachment, Pat Finlay, of the Rape Crisis Centre in Toronto, Barbara Betcherman and Daphne Montagnes, lawyers from Toronto, and Dr. Barry Boyd, the medical director of the Mental Health Centre.

Coulson started the discussion with definition of rape, according to the Canadian Criminal Code. He said a man commits rape when he has sexual intercourse with a woman, who is not

consent, or with her consent, if the consent is obtained by threats, if the consent is obtained by impersonating her husband, or if the consent is obtained by fraudulent

With respect to what a woman should do if she is threatened by a rapist, Coulson said, "You can only do what it is within your character to do." He pointed out that if the woman struggles, she is liable to get overpowered and hurt, and suggested "you have to change his perception of you and of


