## Barber shoppers 'Parade' delights fans

 Midland's Huronia Harmonizers, the 31 voice chapter of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America held their annual parade of harmony last Saturday night at MSS and delighted a large audience.  
 Under the leadership of musical director Glenn Campbell, the group opened the program with O Canada. A number of old, familiar selections followed, including East Side, West Side and After the Ball is Over. Bob Megaw directed the group in The Battle Hymn of the Republic.  
 The Harmonizers produced a rich and tight sound. Their stage appearance was impressive too. They stood straight and tall in their crisp red and white ensembles, and each man was alert and responsive to the director.  
 Master of ceremonies for the evening was David Maw, a member of Etobicoke Chapter. He introduced the Georgian Chordsmen, a new quartet from within the ranks of the Harmonizers, Jack and Bruce Labrie, Henry Light and

Joe Pudifin sing well together, and the high tenor note at the end of Mandy was a pure delight.  
 The tartan jacketed Easy Four from London Ontario were next on the program. They were warmly received by the audience who remembered their excellent performance in Midland at the Harmonizers Charter parade. Their sound was smooth and easy, punctuated by a bouncy rhythm provided by string bass and guitar accompaniment - an unusual but pleasant addition to the barber shop sound. The Easy Four also brought bright humorous touches to the stage.  
 This may be the last public appearance of the Easy Four a group which has been together for ten years. Officially, they have broken up because one of their members has moved from London, but memories of the warm reception they had received in Midland two years ago brought them back.  
 The Parade continued with Canadian Heritage, a guest quartet from Scarborough. Their sound was so ultra-smooth and perfectly blended that it

was easy to understand why this quartet is one of Canada's selections for International competition.  
 As well as traditional selections, this group sang "If", a contemporary love song, and a remarkably beautiful rendition of Danny Boy.  
 The Mid-Knights, a long established quartet from within the Huronia Harmonizers, provided some tuneful and entertaining numbers. Bob Megaw, Glenn Campbell, Doug Strathearn and Alex Widmeyer have been singing Barbershop for a number of years, and it

shows. They are a polished ensemble.  
 During Saturday night's intermission, Harmonizer Bob Armstrong led the audience in some old favourites.

Following the concert, an Afterglow was held at the Hunter's and Angler's Club where there was refreshment and more four part harmony, until two in the morning.

## Ontario has a plan to make it easier.

AHOP/HOME (Assisted Home Ownership Program/ Home Ownership Made Easy Plan) is a federal-provincial program designed to bring home ownership within the reach of moderate and lower income families by offering financial aid in the form of loans, subsidies and grants. How much aid you receive depends upon your household formation, income and the monthly carrying charges for your new home.

All types of new houses are eligible for assistance as long as they are AHOP qualified by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation and are sold within the maximum AHOP prices in your municipality.

Through an AHOP Interest Reduction Loan, the first year's mortgage payments are reduced to an 8% interest rate. An AHOP subsidy of up to \$750 is available during the first year of occupancy so you would not spend more than 25% of your household income on mortgage payments and municipal taxes. You may also qualify for a Provincial HOME Grant of up to \$750 in the first year should your mortgage and tax payments still exceed 30% of your household income. Subsidies and grants are not repayable. Loan repayments begin in the seventh year of the mortgage.

If you are interested in buying a home under the AHOP/HOME Program, look in the real estate section of your newspaper for participating builders.
