The audience soon learned that Mrs. Tracey is most knowledgeable in the care and culture of house plants. Mrs. Tracey specialized in african violets and their relatives, begonias, and as she put it "the odds and ends" such as miniature geraniums, min-gloxias, some succulents and

a variety of orchids, many of which were brought for display.

A most detailed and comprehensive lecture was given from how to start plants from seed to soil preparations and the use of automatic watering and what kind of light systems to use. Mrs. Tracey certainly sent everyone home with many new and somewhat ingenious methods in the care of house plants.

The next meeting will be on Monday, April 30 in Regent Public School. This will be the spring flower show, when all the tulips, flowering shrubs, perennials and roses will be judged and on display.

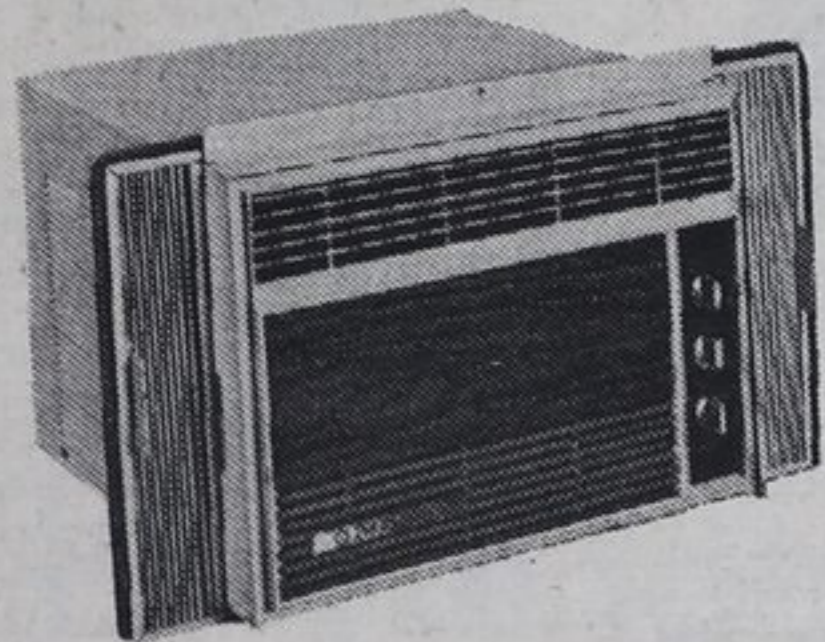
