THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF PORT McNICOLL SUMMARY OF ZONING **BY-LAW NUMBER 533**

The Council of the Corporation of the Village of Port McNicoll intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act for approval of By-law Number 533 passed on the 7th day of May, 1974.

The purpose and effect of the By-law is to regulate and prohibit the use of land except for such purposes as may be set out in the By-law for all of the land within the Village of Port McNicoll.

The By-law will regulate and prohibit the erection or use of buildings or structures for or except for such purposes as are set out in the By-law and will regulate the height, bulk, location, size, floor area, spacing, character and use of buildings or structures to be erected, and the minimum frontage and depth of parcels of land, and the proportion of the area thereof that any buildings or structures may occupy and for requiring the owners or occupants of buildings or structures to be erected or used for purposes named in the By-law and to provide and maintain loading or parking facilities on land that is not part of a highway.

The By-law shall apply to all lands within the limits of the Corporation of the Village of Port McNicoll, which lands are divided into zones which will be designated either residential, commercial, industrial open space, public service or excempted forms. There is no present zoning for any land within the Corporation of the Village of Port McNicoll and By-law Number 533 when approved by the Ontario Municipal Board will bring about the first zoning of your land. The purpose of this By-law is to regulate and prohibit land use within the Village to allow orderly development and use on a predetermined basis.
