Owl talk May 19

No one can claim that Katherine and Larry McKeever "don't give a hoot" for conservation. Their owl rehabilitation centre in Vineland, Ontario is famous throughout North America.

Although they specialize in owls, they accept all birds of prey that are injured. Many birds are subsequently released to the wild while the incurable are retained for a captive breeding program. Their primary aim is to rehabilitate native North American species although no raptorial bird from any country is refused. The McKeevers have 'resolved to avoid the pitfalls of most so-called sanctuaries where injured birds are accepted but given no real treatment." They treat injured birds in various ways, following up with hunting therapy before release to the natural environment.

It began as a 'Halfway House' for rehabilitation of those released from the Mental Centre or jail. In January '76 a L.I.P. grant was received to make it into a Detox Centre.


