Clarke Stewart of Midland was sentenced Monday to eight months in jail after pleading guilty to two counts of assault causing bodily harm and one charge of common assault. Stewart will also be under probation for one year after being released.

The case was heard at an earlier date but the sentencing was slated for Monday.

Alcohol was involved in all three counts and Stewart's lawyer, Greg Rice suggested that Stewart needed some form of counselling for his drinking problem. Stewart said he was willing to accept counselling and said he was genuinely sorry for the incidents. A bad choice of friends was also part of the problem he said, and he intended to leave the province.

Crown attorney Thomas Cleary pointed out that two of the assaults occurred while Stewart was on bail from previous charges and Stewart also had a previous record of assault, theft and causing a disturbance.
