wanted to get rid of the Davis government," he said. "Stephen didn't respond to that mood."

He said the party would have to re-think its strategy before the next election, and should have told the electorate it would turn Ontario into a social democratic province like Manitoba and Saskatchewan. He said a more aggressive approach would have cost the party votes in Toronto, but would have helped in the rest of the province.




