### Sailing School program starts July 4

The Junior Program begins July 4, 1977 and runs until August 26, 1977. This includes four two-week sessions at a cost of

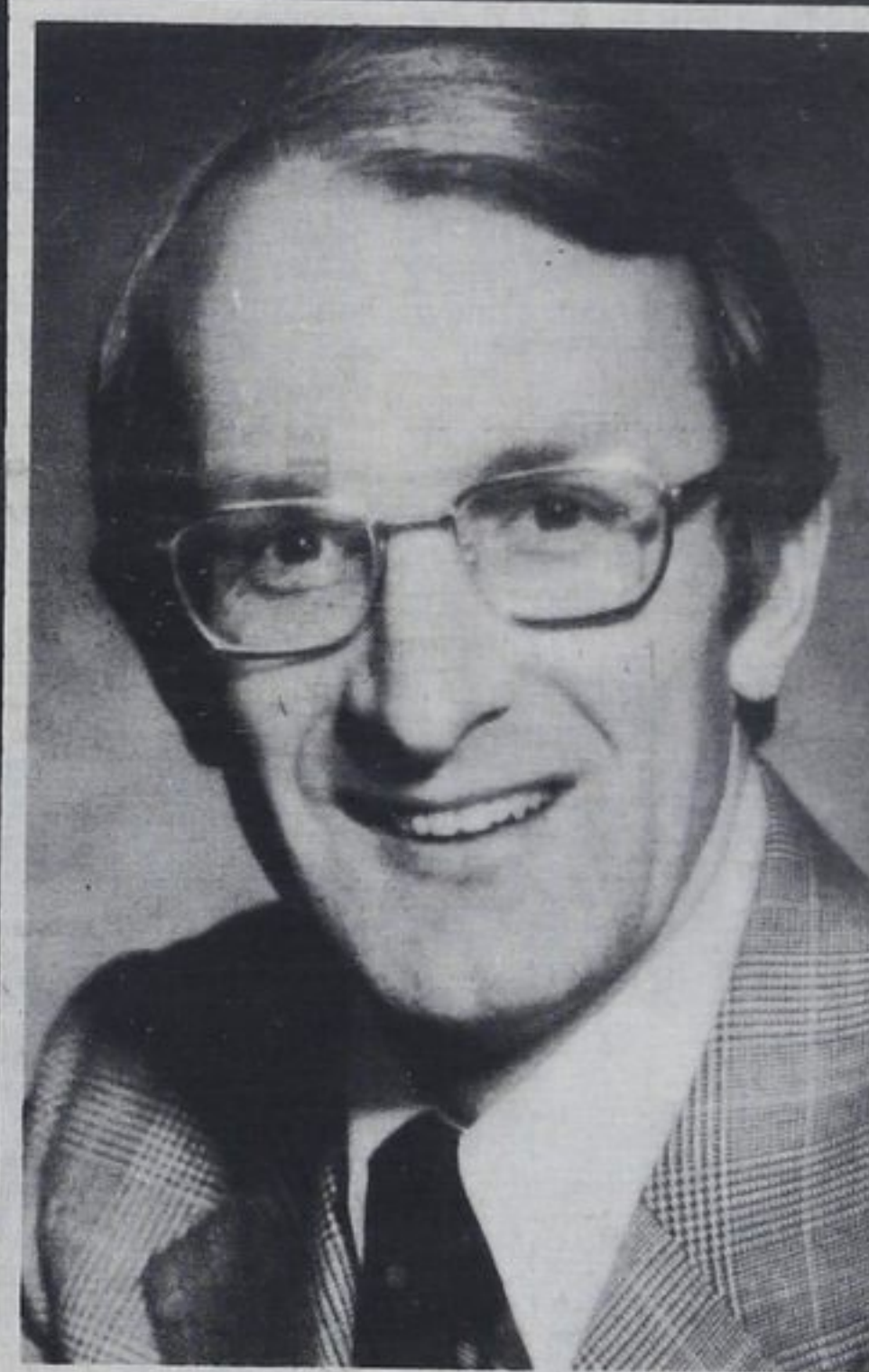

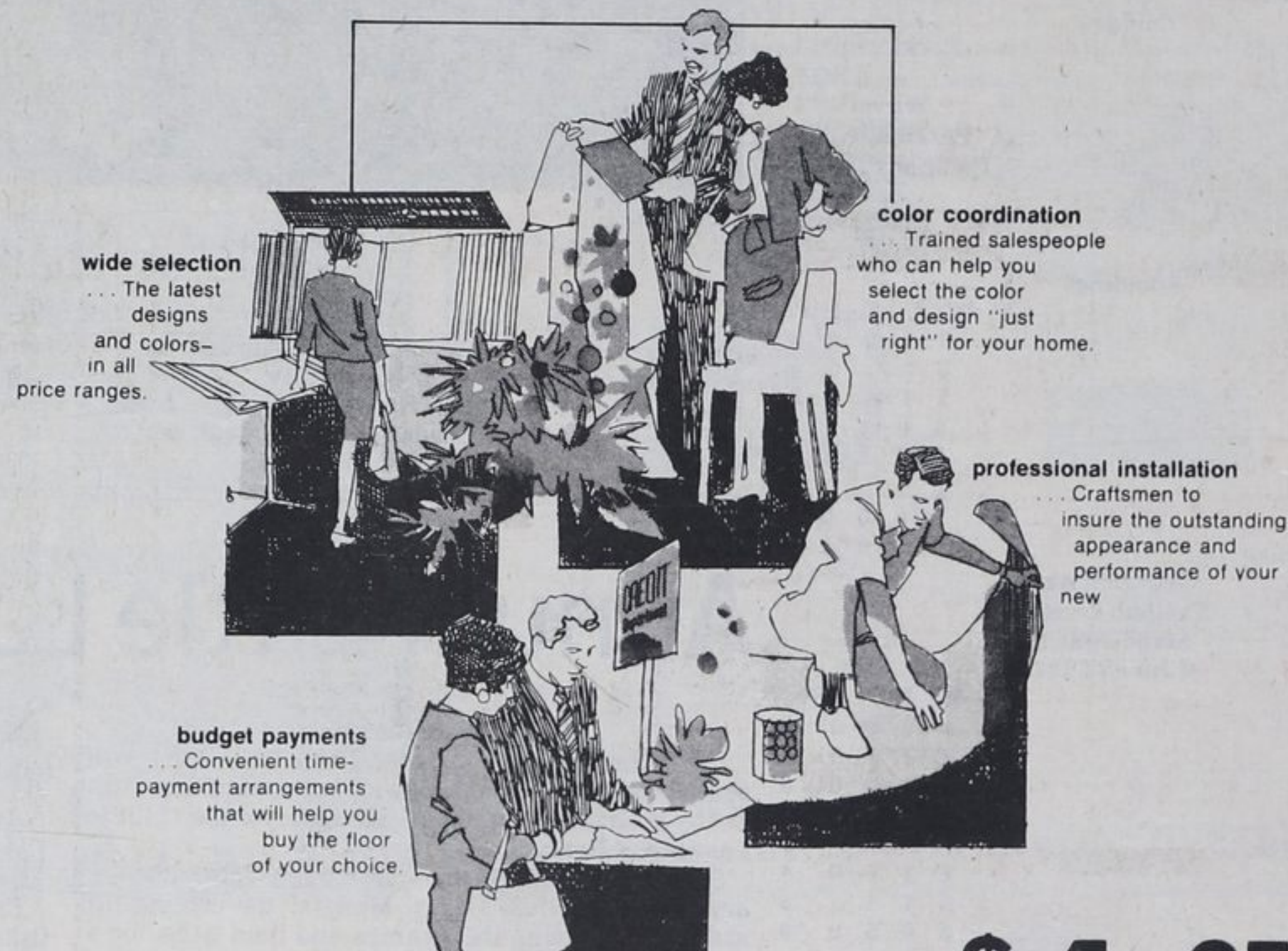
