Currency displays at Museum

pieces of currency on display at Huronia Museum in Little Lake Park, Midland. The \$4. bill was issued by the Canadian Government in 1882 and was centered with a picture of the Marquis of Lorne. An extremely in-

teresting display of currency, coin and antique banks has been put together by Rod Smith of Aurora, and is now part of the permanent display in the Museum.

Among the numerous strange looking bills are \$3 and \$5 denominations issued by the Bank of Clifton at Niagara Falls. These fancy designed bills were printed on rice paper, and on one side only. Two other rice paper examples were issued by the Colonial Bank of Canada in \$4 and \$5 denominations. They were serially numbered by hand in pen and ink. Individual banks were still issuing their own currency in the early part of this century, and among the examples are \$5 and \$10 Bank of Toronto bills printed on yellow paper.

There are, of course, several examples of Canadian "Shin Plasters", the small bill issued in 25 cent denomination when there was a scarcity of silver.

The latest, of course, is the United States \$2 bill, which that country just started issuing in recent years. It is understood that these are still not widely accepted by the

American people. The coin collection holds some very interesting old Spanish "Pieces of Eight", as well as well as "Tokens" from and Lower Canada, before Con-


