Township of Flos Official Plan Amendment
Take notice that the Planning Board of the Corporation of the Township of Flos shall hold a public meeting on June 20, 1977 between the hours of 7:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. at the Township Office, Elmvalle to review the proposed Amendment.
PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT
The purpose of the Amendment is to change the designation of part of Lot 4, Concession 3 from "Rural" to "Tourist Commercial".
LOCATION OF LANDS AFFECTED
The affected lands comprise some 25 acres having access to Concession Road 4, about 1/2 mile east of Fergusonville on Highway 27, approximately 10 miles north of the City of Barrie and 5 miles south of the Village of Elmvalle.
BASIS FOR THE AMENDMENT
The Official Plan is intended to give direction and order to growth and change within the planning area. It is also intended to reflect the wishes of the municipality it serves.
An application to amend the Official Plan has been received by the

Township, the intent of which is to have certain lands presently designated "Rural" in the Official Plan, redesignated to "Tourist Commercial". The purpose of this change would be to allow the establishment of an overnight tent and trailer camp for tourists at the area described above. This proposed facility would, when completed, have some one hundred and seventeen camp sites, a swimming pool, play area, recreation hall, washrooms and other facilities.
Accordingly, and in keeping with the intent of council to subject the Plan to periodic review, and to ensure public participation in planning decisions, a public meeting has been scheduled at the above noted time and place.
Interested persons may obtain copies of the proposed Amendment at the Township Office, Elmvalle. Council and Planning Board invite those who wish to present written submissions or make comments to do so at the public meeting.

Happy Cooker



There's an entertaining story making the rounds about a TV commercial made for the Pork Marketing Board which features pork chops in a dish called Canadian Redcoat. The commercial was centered on a Mountie—sort of a gourmet gendarme. "Halt!"— said the CRT. "You are not allowed to use an RCMP in a commercial."
The promo was redesigned, but not the recipe which is reprinted below. Canadian Redcoat looks very pretty on the platter garnished with fresh fruit. It also tastes excellent and here are the instructions:
Canadian Redcoat
6 double pork chops, 1 1/2 inches thick.
Marinade:
1 1/2 cups soy sauce
1 cup apple juice
1/2 cup water
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 tablespoon dark molasses
1 teaspoon salt
In a small saucepan mix marinade ingredients. Bring to a boil and cool. Place chops in a deep dish, bone side up. Pour marinade over chops. Let stand in refrigerator overnight, basting occasionally if possible.
Wipe marinade from chops with a paper towel and place them in a baking dish, covering it tightly with foil.
Bake in 325 degree oven until tender—1 1/2 hours. (At this stage, chops may be wrapped and stored in refrigerator or freezer).
Meanwhile, combine the red sauce ingredients in heavy saucepan.
Red Sauce:
3/4 cup catsup
3/4 cup chili sauce
1/2 cup apple juice
1/4 cup brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
Blend together and bring to a boil. Simmer 20 minutes. Dip cooked chops in red sauce and place in baking dish. Bake for 30 minutes in 325 degrees oven until lightly glazed, basting occasionally.
This makes six servings, and the pork producers suggest you serve it with broccoli, brussel sprouts or buttered cabbage, and pan browned potatoes.
