John Gorman presented the Constitution of the Big Sister's of Huronia for consideration by the Board of Directors. The Constitution, written by John Gorman, Nell Peever and Rev. Norm Watson will be approved, if no changes are deemed necessary, at the annual meeting to be held September 12, 1977.

President Joan Roszmann said there are twelve Little Sisters matched to twelve Big Sisters.

Mrs. Roszmann emphasized the goal of the Big Sister's Association is towards giving extra guidance and friendship to troubled young girls. "We reach out not only to motherless girls," she pointed out, "but to girls with both parents."

"We help girls who need special attention to help them overcome the 'growing pains' they may be experiencing."
