

Guilty of causing a disturbance

Two men caught fighting in Port McNicoll pay \$25 'for the privilege'

Two men who engaged in a fight in Port McNicoll last month were convicted and fined in provincial court in Penetanguishene last Thursday, on charges of causing a disturbance. Michael McCluskey, 21, of Victoria Harbour, and Athanase Ziatas, 36, of Scarborough, were jointly

charged on June 12, following a fight in the Port McNicoll Inn parking lot. The court was told that a constable on patrol in the village at about 1:15 a.m., witnessed the fight, which was being watched by about 20 to 25 spectators. The crown attorney said the two had ap-

parently had an argument inside the inn, which had carried over into the parking lot after the establishment had closed for the night. Visiting provincial judge C.P. Opper asked the two accused if they had indeed been fighting, and when they answered yes, he said, "Well, you

have to pay for the privilege." He then fined each of them \$25, or five days in jail. **Excess alcohol** A 29-year-old Kenora man, involved in an accident last week, was convicted in provincial court last Thursday of excess alcohol. Terry Andrews was

charged on Sunday, July 3, after he was involved in a two-car collision at about 6:10 p.m. The court was told he had been attempting to pass a car and trailer, when it tried to make a left turn, and they collided. Officers attending at the scene noticed a smell of alcohol on Andrews' breath, and requested that he take a breathalyzer test. The result was a reading of .170.

Duty counsel told the court Andrews had been having marital difficulties at the time, and man, charged with having the care or control of an automobile while having too much alcohol

was told a constable on routine patrol in the village had spotted a car parked at the junction of two streets, and had gone over to investigate. They discovered Jenkins behind the wheel and noticed a smell of alcohol on his breath. A breathalyzer test yielded a reading of .110.

Jenkins was ordered to pay a fine of \$110, or spend 10 days in jail. **Driving disqualified** A 28-year-old Wyebridge man was fined

\$100 in provincial court Thursday, after he pleaded guilty to a charge of driving while disqualified by reason of a legal suspension. Henry Eggengoor was charged on June 16 at 6:30 p.m., when he was stopped on Highway 27 for a routine check. The court was told his licence had been suspended on December 13 of last year, as a result of the non-payment of a judgment under the Motor Vehicle Accident

Claims act. Duty counsel told the court Eggengoor had been driving on the day in question because he had been working on a rush order at his garage in Wyebridge, and needed extra parts. The lawyer assured the court it was a one-time occurrence, and that Eggengoor had not been in the habit of driving while his licence was suspended. The judge ordered him to pay the \$100 fine, spend 10 days in jail.
