The financial statement for 1976 also shows no indication of a reported sum of money borrowed from PUC accounts from a PUC member for private use. Ratepayer Ed Hill made the initial revelation and a

ratepayer at Sunday's meeting confirmed the incident did take place.

"The financial statement doesn't show any discrepancy," said Cook.

"I gather that it has been paid back," added

Stevens. The only mystery left to solve by the ratepayers association is what exactly happened to surplus profits in PUC accounts from previous years. To this end the association has requested financial statements dating back to 1970.

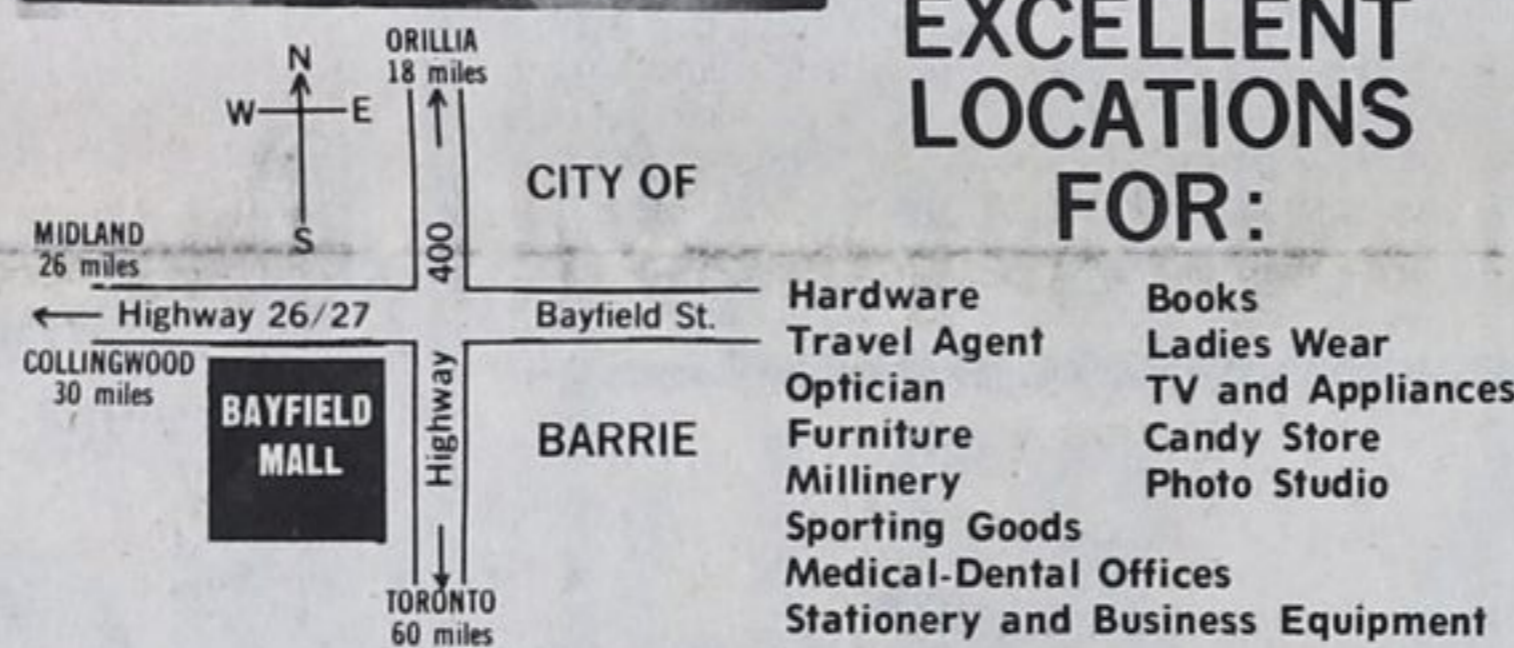

- The Business Practices Act provides fines and jail terms for people who deliberately deceive, mislead or lie to consumers.
