## OMB is coming

Port McNicoll and Victoria Harbour will be having Ontario Municipal Board (O.M.B.) hearings for all the people interested in supporting or opposing the zoning bylaws. The Port McNicoll hearing is slated for August 22, 23, and 24 but all this time may not be necessary. There are approximately 120 objections to the zoning bylaw in Port McNicoll but they mainly fall in two categories. One of these groups includes the people who own land in the beach area and would like the seasonal zoning changed so they may have permanent dwellings there. This would require proper servicing of the land.

The Ministry of Environment will be advising the OMB on this matter. The second bone of contention in the Port McNicoll area is the beach land which is zoned for industrial use. In Victoria Harbour residents will be able to voice their objections on August 9. Each property owner was given a copy of the Restricted Area Bylaw well over a year ago and was given 21 days to submit their oppositions. As in Port McNicoll, the

## Annual antique show improving yearly

Back in 1966, when the first Antique Market was sponsored by the Hospital Auxiliary, it was hastily organized by a group with considerably more enthusiasm than knowledge! By the following year, the same group, realizing all the pitfalls and problems that they had so narrowly missed, wondered how that first "Market" managed to be so successful. Today, 12 years later, the Summer Antique Market, believed to be the second longest-running annually held show in Ontario, is still going

strong and improving each year. This year's convener, Mrs. D. A. McPherson, was the original convener and a great many of the original group are still happily and efficiently carrying out their appointed tasks. Always held at the Country Mill, a very suitable setting, the Market will open its doors Tuesday, July 19 at 7 p.m. and continue through Wednesday and Thursday, July 20 - 21, from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Each year, the Market committee starts working in March, contacting dealers (there is now a waiting list); organizing the master floor plan of the Mill for the 18 dealers' booths; deciding how much and where the publicity and advertising dollars will be spent — on posters, cards, banners, radio, television, newspapers and magazines; listing the work hours for auxiliaries who are always present to assist the dealers during the show.

Newcomers this year are Cormack Antiques, Mississauga and Paterson's of Dorchester. Returning for the second time is Mare's Nest Antiques, Dunsford. In their third year are Two Unicorns, Paris; Ivan's Antiques, Brampton; Tom Riordan, Willowdale. William Yates, Toronto is back for his fourth year.

For six years, Doris Turnbull, Brampton and The Red Lion, Collector's Bookshelf, Toronto have taken part in the Market. Mollie's Antiques and Mrs. Margaret Olson, "The Pennyweight" Toronto have renewed old friendships with auxiliaries for seven years. Mrs. Olson was one of the charter dealers, 12 years ago.

The House of Charles, Port Colborne, Irene's Antiques, Trenton and Agnes Gillespie, Toronto will participate for the eighth year. It's the ninth year for Bourrie's, Willowdale, the 10th for Drake's, Toronto and the

11th for Markham's, Toronto. For the 12th consecutive year, Herb Merry, the "Paulie Berrig" shop, Victoria Harbour, and the only "100 percent attendance" dealer will be back in his usual corner booth.

For the first time, the admission price has been increased to a still reasonable \$1.50. However, this year, the ticket also gives the buyer a chance on one of the many beautiful door prizes to be given away nightly. Made or donated by auxiliaries, these include: three afghans, three needlepoint pictures, a baby layette, tablecloth, placemats, painting one piece of hammered copper and a large basket of edible "goodies".

Stepping into the Market is like taking a step backward in time, to the days when the first little auxiliary boasting 22 members was formed more than 70 years ago. Come and enjoy!
