Simcoe County is looking to Grey and Bruce regions for support in their bid to have this area included in the territories eligible for a larger percentage of Wintario funding.

The Southern Ontario Region including Simcoe is currently eligible for Wintario grants with Wintario matching dollar \$1.00 raised locally. for dollar the money raised by the private sector. The total grant is not to exceed one-third of construction in what they


